this access. Councillors were concerned that whilst the income due the PC was welcome, given the regularity of the access perhaps a weekly charge would be more equitable to the owners. Concern was also expressed about the parking of contractor vehicles on the car park and the potential long term effects to the car park surface. It was agreed the Chair should contact the Old School owners and discuss these issues. (Action: Chair)

16/34 Any Other Business

The question of Neighbourhood Watch was raised. There was some discussion about the nature of the role and whether it was one that the PC was 'responsible' for. It was agreed that the Chair and Clerk should clarify the responsibilities. (**Action**: Chair/Clerk)

Concern was expressed again at the frequency of heavy lorries travelling East – West through the village on the A362. It was noted that there seemed to be increased use of agricultural vehicles using the same route and a question was asked whether the weight restrictions on the road also applied to these vehicles.
