Have you had your 'flu jab? You should!

I don't know anyone who likes injections. At best, you tolerate them because they are doing you good. Even then, if you have never had 'flu you may not see the point of having the optional 'flu jab. "That is for people who get the 'flu, isn't it?" "Surely, even they don't need it, as once you have caught something, aren't you immune to it?" "Anyway, I've heard that the 'flu jab isn't effective." No, no and no!

Unlike many infections where the infectious agent is pretty much the same from year to year, such as the measles or mumps viruses, the influenza virus changes. Some years it gives a relatively mild infection, but at other times it can be devastating. For example, it is estimated that the infamous Spanish Flu of 1918-19 killed up to 50 million people world-wide; 228,000 in the UK alone compared with 700,000 UK deaths over the four years of the First World War. This is a problem when it comes to making the 'flu vaccine. The pharmaceutical companies that make the vaccine have to predict which strain of 'flu will be prevalent next winter, as it takes at least 6 months to create sufficient doses of vaccine. Sometimes the predictions don't quite work out, so the 2014 vaccine was not as effective as hoped against the main strain of influenza. However, most of the time the vaccine works well.

It is particularly important this year to be immunised if you are over 65, are very



young (who receive a nasal spray), or have certain medical problems. You could be more susceptible to influenza than many of the population because your immune system may not be as robust. It is also important if you work in day care, healthcare, or some other professions, such as teaching. This may prevent you passing the 'flu to someone less able than you to cope with the infection. The virus coming this winter is a nasty one.

How do we know this? The Australian 'flu season is out-of-phase with ours and it has been a particularly bad season on the other side of the world. There have been at least 170,000 cases and 72 deaths in a population of about 21 million. A similar proportion of the Australian and UK populations live in cities, so we might expect over half a million cases in the UK, and over 200 deaths.

However, things may change in future. Influenza vaccines have historically been raised against the proteins on the surface of the 'flu virus, and different variants of these proteins are found in the different strains that are most common from year to year. This is why the best 'flu vaccine has to be predicted and produced each year. Very recent work from Australia and the US, published this (Northern) summer, has shown that part of a protein that does not vary between strains may be used as a vaccine. This is the first time that there is a real chance of having a 'flu vaccine that works year-on-year. If this succeeds in clinical trials, the 'flu jab may become a single event, rather than an annual one. In the meantime, have your 'flu iab!

Chapmanslade and Corsley Operation Christmas Child



A big 'thank you' to everyone who so generously gave shoe boxes full of gifts for the children in needy countries.

The 'GO' boxes have again proved very popular, although some of us still enjoy wrapping our shoe box. On Sunday 5th November we gathered most the shoe boxes together and blessed them before sending them on their way. This year 61 shoeboxes were collected from St Margaret's Church, St Philip & St James' Church and Little Cuckoos and delivered to the warehouse in Warminster where they will be made ready for their final destination.

Each box is checked to ensure that all items included are suitable and that any unsuitable items are re-distributed to other charities. The boxes are then sealed and packed into large cartons which are stacked onto pallets before being loaded on to lorries. Each vehicle will transport between 10,000 and 13,000 boxes which, at this time of year, travel out almost weekly.



Parish Council Briefing

Chairman, Neil Britten, reports on the PCs activities and community info

Last month was a very quiet month for the PC, with no meetings. This brief is thus confined to planning application feedback and advance notice of two key items for next year.

Previous Planning Applications

The two applications below were approved with standard conditions. The PC had registered no objection to either of them.

17/08473/FUL - Gloworm Cottage, **Heath Close** – single storey side extension and new porch.

17/07555/FUL - Court Lane Farm -Conversion of outbuilding to workshop including associated works

Annual Parish Meeting 2018

All Parish Councils in England are required by law to hold an Annual Parish Meeting. It is not a PC meeting, but very much a village gathering, with the PC providing the Chair. The meeting is intended to allow the PC to explain what they have been doing over the last year and for local community organisations to do so if they wish. It is also the occasion for electors to have their say on anything which they consider is important to the people of the parish. The meeting will take place early in March at a date yet to be confirmed.

In the recent past, the PC has offered the subjects for discussion, with broadband and Longleat's plans the mainstays. However,

the PC would very much like to hear from the village what its concerns are and what it would like to see on the agenda. There will another notice in The Bridge next month with deadlines for input.

Grants and donations

Each year the PC invites bids from village organisations for grants and donations towards their costs, with a deadline at the end of January. There will be a formal notice inviting bids in the January edition of The Bridge, with further explanation of the process; this short notice is included here as an encouragement to get people thinking in advance of the festive season.

Seven Open Doors

Dear Friends,

Early November, and I am driven crazy attempting to shop in a supermarket stuffed to the hilt with 'Christmas treats'. I honestly want to run away and hide until Christmas morning; well perhaps Christmas Eve as the midnight service is my favourite. Any mention of the 'C' word results in a rolling of eyes and expressions of horror at the unmitigated slog that is purported to be necessary if the big day is to be a 'success', which would be laughable really if it wasn't so sad. Peel back the layers, stop fussing about the wretched turkey, forget about what on earth you are going to buy ancient Aunty Flo, stop, just for a minute. If possible wrap up warm and go outside when it's dark and you can see the moon and the stars...

'O Lord, our Sovereign,
how majestic is your name in all the earth!
You have set your glory above the heavens ---When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers,
the moon and the stars that you have established;
4 what are human beings that you are mindful of them,
mortals that you care for them?

'When I look at the heavens, the work of your fingers' writes the psalmist, inviting us to look up, to lift our eyes beyond the crushing concerns of our broken world to the glory of the night sky, to the moon and stars, inviting us consider that being beyond all time, that being who created each and everyone of us, who knows each and every one of us at the deepest level, whose spirit inhabits each and every one of us. And that being, who created all things, who loves us whoever we are and whatever we have done, came to share what it means to be human in the most vulnerable way possible, in the form of a baby.

Whether or not you consider the Christmas story to be 'true', whatever that means, is immaterial, the question we need to be asking is what is the gospel writer trying to tell us through the story. The posh word for God coming to share our humanity is the incarnation, and one of the posh words for Jesus is Emmanuel, which means, God with us. God with us and for us, not as some pie in the sky old man wagging his finger at us but as one whose love means he shares everything about what it means to be human, even the messy dark bits, because after all, a smelly dark stable is about as messy as it gets.

The Christmas story isn't about success it's about love. 'The Advent bells call out "Prepare' Your world is journeying to the birth Of God made man for us on earth.' (Bentjeman)

May God's love surround you and your family this Christmas tide, Love and prayers, Pauline





Countryside Matters

December and January see us working on the farm half in daylight and half in powered light. By late afternoon, the milking cows are either going through the milking parlour or enjoying the high-energy and protein food harvested from the farm, mixed with some bought-in food such as soya. Each feed ingredient is weighed and put into mangers in the collecting/exercise yards.


Whilst the cows are feeding or being milked, the rubber matting in their cubicles are cleaned – each cow has the freedom to walk around or enjoy the comfort of their very own cubicle for the night.

Security lights are essential for the animals and for those caring for them; doors and gates are locked against the elements and wandering animals.

High winds, heavy rainfall and snow can cause lots of problems as does frost when it freezes the drinking water. The milking parlour also freezes up and the yards are like an ice rink.

Heaters are now installed to automatically switch on in the milking parlour when the temperature falls below 5 degrees to allow the milking of the cows whatever the weather

The pregnant cows are loose-housed on fresh straw bedding and, when doing the late-night check, it is a joy to hear the gentle snoring of the cows. Amongst them, a calf may naturally come into the world, with just a few of the cows looking on in wonderment



on insects. Foxes will slink around the hedges to find pheasants that failed to get back to the pens or up to roost in woodland cover. Once alerted, the pheasants put up a tremendous racket which reverberates throughout the woodland, so the fox has to make the most of his first opportunity to get his supper or he goes home hungry.

During the last 20 years since badgers became a protected species, their numbers have exploded and they just love our greensand soil for burrowing. As they have very poor eyesight, they find their way to food and water with their excellent sense of smell and sensitive snout, feeding on earthworms, cereal crops waiting to be harvested and, just like an urban fox, will find their way into food storage areas in farm building. On a regular night-patrol, it is not unknown to find a badger shuffling towards you at quite a pace, guite oblivious of your presence until really close up!

The countryside at night can be very busy whilst most of us are slumbering!




