

Rainfall for 2014 in Corsley



Victoria Bridge, Bath

In September 2014 on a chance visit to Victoria Bridge, Bath, Nigel Bridewell of Chapmanslade discovered that, courtesv of a grant of £3.5 million from English Heritage, the bridge was being restored. It was built by his Great, great uncle, James Dredge, who was also born and raised in Chapmanslade, James owned Norfolk Brewery near Victoria Park, Bath and built the suspension bridge in order to be able to deliver his beer to the other side of the River Avon. The undertaking was so successful that James left his brothers to run the brewery and went building similar bridges ground Britain and abroad, even as far as India and Jamaica

On his way back from treatment for a broken arm at Royal United Hospital, Nigel, together with his friend Anne Filkins, visited the site every couple of weeks to follow the progress of the work. He and a fourth cousin, Stewart Dredge from Edinburgh, provided assistance to Alf Perry of English Heritage in researching the Dredge family history.

On 15th January an opening ceremony took place at which Nigel and Stewart, whom Nigel had never met, were presented with a commemorative book of the history of the many suspension bridges their Great, great uncle had built. The Chapmanslade History Group had visited the bridge a few weeks before and an exhibition of documentation and items can be seen at the Guild Hall, Bath.



Parish Council Briefing

The Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the latest meeting...

Things were fairly quiet over the Christmas period, with just one occasional PC meeting on 13 January to discuss a planning application and a major update to PC Standing Orders. We have also had a brief update from the Council House Development team.

Planning Application

14/11767/FUL. This was a full application by a family building firm, McIntosh DBR. of Knowle Farm, Compton Martin, for erection of two detached dwellings and associated garaging at Squires Coal Yard, Lane End. Conditional upon success with this application, McIntosh will purchase the site.

This was the third application for development of the site, the first two being for outline permission. Permission was previously granted subject to reserved matters relating to the scale of the proposed new houses, the layout, external appearance and landscaping, with two additional conditions concerning access and turning areas, and disposal of surface water.

Residents of Roddenbury View, who had opposed this application and its precursors, were present together with representatives of McIntosh DBR. All were given the opportunity to speak. The major areas of concern were the potential overlook, maintenance access to the retaining wall between the development site and the

rear gardens of the Roddenbury View and the height of the proposed houses. The PC supported the application subject to conditions that the developer provided a 2 metre fence on top of the boundary wall. the ridge height of both houses was lower than Nos 2 and 3 Roddenbury View and that a covenant was placed to ensure that the boundary retaining wall would be properly maintained in perpetuity.

Affordable Housing

Some progress has been made, in that an initial site visit to Baytree has been made by Wiltshire's 'Asset Management team'. As a result, the internal build officer has recommended that initial planning feasibilities studies are undertaken and by the time of publication of this Bridge these should have been instructed. These should include input from Planning and Highways. That report will then be assessed to check the viability and feasibility of building houses/bungalows on the site.

Please note that it is likely there will be officials visiting the site over the next few weeks.

Bids for PC funding

I mentioned last month that, traditionally, the PC has given grants to the Readings Rooms, the Memorial Playing Field, Corsley and Chapmanslade Parochial Church Council and the Baptist Church. As a reminder,

village organisations are invited to make bids for donations for the year 2015/16, to be sent to the Parish Clerk, John WILLCOX (corslevpc idw@aol.co.uk - note the underscore - or by hand to Little Orchard, Lyes Green). Those received by 1st March will be considered. The bids should include extant accounts for the organisation, show how the organisation benefits the Parish of Corsley and relate to a specific project. To date only one application has been received.

Streetscene and footpaths

The same advice as last month – we are in the season of heavy rain squalls, blocked drains and debris being washed down from bridleways and fields. Please look after any drains or ditches close to your property or that you come across on walks and for any serious issues please call Clarence. Any problems with footpaths, please let Gill Parkinson know

Salt bins have all been replenished and the Parish has some additional salt which will be

used for Gevs Hill and vulnerable junctions; subject to manpower and vehicles being made available at the time.

Three Open Doors

Dear Friends,

As I sit at my desk preparing to write this letter two images are rattling around my head; one is of the snowdrops that are appearing in their droves in the churchyards, little candles of hope in these dark cold days. And the other is a photograph of two good-looking young men, arms wrapped around each other's shoulders, faces lit up by beaming smiles as they pose proudly for the camera, radiating an exuberant youthful promise. I looked at the photograph for a long time and thought how innocent they looked, how similar to my sons. Except these young men are dressed in the uniform of war, their weapons and ammunition proudly displayed on their bodies for all to see, these young men would give their lives - and probably will - for a cause they passionately believe in. And you have to ask yourself the question: What happened? What vacuum in somebody's life provides the breeding ground for extreme radicalisation and indeed what ills in our society provide the wider context for all this? What is it that enables a perfectly ordinary young man to believe that inflicting violence and terror on other human beings is the right thing to do?

Clearly, such behaviour is totally unacceptable, but it doesn't arise out of no-where. In our shock and fearfulness it's easy for us to distance ourselves from those who perpetrate such attacks by convincing ourselves that somehow such people are 'other'. In doing so we can then absolve ourselves of any responsibility for the creation of a society where disaffected young men are easy targets for radicalisation and subsequent involvement in terrorism.

The threat of terrorism understandably makes us all edgy and fearful and being fearful can have a profound effect upon the way we engage with those whom we perceive to be 'different'. In trying to frame a response to all this I keep coming back to the story of the Good Samaritan. It's not the cosy story we love to tell; Jews and Samaritans were mortal enemies, it was an absolute no-no for them to mix in any way shape or form and the notion of a 'good' Samaritan is an oxymoron that would have had Jesus' listeners shaking their heads in disbelief. In having the Samaritan stop and tend to the injured Jew Jesus smashes through centuries of hatred and mistrust and shows us that 'There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus.' (Galatians 3: 28)

All of us are part of the human family; the story of The Good Samaritan is Jesus' answer to the question 'Who is my neighbour?' At this time of uncertainty and fear we must do all we can to promote respect and tolerance with regard to those whose beliefs are different to ours. When we feel threatened it is horribly tempting to retreat into ghetto mentality and build walls of mistrust; far better to respond to our own fears by reaching out to others to enable dialogue that enhances mutual respect and understanding. And that brings me back to the snowdrops; just as you wait and wait and then out of the cold earth they miraculously appear, in our sad old world it often hard to see signs of beauty and hope amidst the darkness. Let's pray that we can have the courage to be such signs by refusing to kowtow to an agenda of fear and by loving our neighbour – who ever that might be – as ourselves.

Corsley Chalice on Display in Salisbury

We are delighted that Salisbury Museum has chosen to put St Margaret church's 16th century Chalice on public display alongside the Lacock Cup in the coming weeks. The Lacock Cup will be on show at a number of locations in the county over the coming months, starting in Salisbury from 31st January until 4th May.

The Corsley Chalice, with its accompanying paten, or plate, is normally kept under lock and key in Salisbury Cathedral and rarely sees the light of day. On special occasions, however, for example the licensing of a new incumbent, it is sometimes brought back to Corsley and used in services. Rev Pauline Reid's licensing as priest in charge of the Cley Hill Villages benefice in October 2014 was the last time the Chalice was used in the village.

Not a great deal is known about the Chalice and paten. In 1553 the Crown Commissioners took 20oz of silver for the King from Corsley (this was a common practice when the monarch was short of money!) and left only 7 1/2 ozs. Of the plate they left, a silver-gilt paten of c1510 still remains. The Chalice which they left was remodelled in the 1570s. As far as is known, the Chalice and plate have never been valued; certainly the parish has no intention of selling them!

Phil Jefferson commented that villagers were delighted that the decision had been chosen to display the Chalice alongside its Lacock cousin. He said "We appreciate that our Chalice is not as well known or indeed as valuable as the Lacock Cup, but we are very proud of this part of our heritage and we thank Salisbury Museum for making it available to be seen by the public throughout the Spring". Reverend Pauline Reid, Priest-in Charge, added, "I feel very privileged to have used the cup for the purpose it was intended on the Sunday after the service, it was an extraordinary feeling to administer communion with something that held such meaning for the parish and connected us to past communicants in such a profound way. A real joy."

Corsley WI January News



Carol Seward rounds up the January meeting and announces some forthcoming events

At the first meeting of 2015, members of Corsley WI were treated to a 'Korean Odyssey'. South Korea is possibly best known for its Dictator, the Korean War in the 1950's and for 'Gananam Style'! However, for the first part of the 20th century, the Japanese occupied the whole of North and South Korea and destroyed much of the country. Whilst the North was more economically viable, the South struggled through lack of natural resources but in recent years there has been much new development in South Korea. Palaces are being restored and there are many new bia hotels. An extremely mountainous country, space to build is at a premium and therefore there are vast numbers of skyscrapers in town centres and the residential areas have large high-rise blocks of flats.

Our speaker, the Rev. In 1886 there would have been only about 25 Churches, but by 1995 the number had grown to over 10 million, with about 1.5 million Methodists. Churches are now extremely popular, with some having enormous congregations of over 100,000 members. Pauline Scott gave the vote of thanks for the most interesting talk.



Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Phil Jefferson reports from Chapmanslade Parish Council

Over 30 residents attended our meeting held on 15th January.

Barters Farm Development

Leah Walker introduced his new business partner, Lochailort Investments Limited. Hugo Haig, Lochailort's Managing Director, and his colleague Jamie Allen, gave a presentation on how the housing development on part of the Barters Farm site might look.

Mr Haig stressed that his company's work was at a relatively early stage and that he would not proceed with the development if the Chapmanslade community rejected it. However, 40 houses were proposed (in line with the previous plan), ranging from one to five bedrooms, of which 30% would be onsite subsidised and affordable housing.

Mr Haig told us that he aimed to create a sensitive, well-considered and high quality development of which the village and wider area would be proud. There would be extensive use of traditional, locally typical materials including brick and render elevations, slate and tile roofs, and selective use of flint and stone. Access would be provided to neighbouring properties to the

south and west of the development and building lines would diminish to 1.5 storeys along the corresponding boundaries. He added that car-parking provision would be enhanced, all parking would be off-street and there would be ample parking for each unit. This, together with planting to the front garden areas, would produce attractive uncluttered areas. The roads themselves would include raised tables to reduce speed and different surface materials would be utilised to soften the appearance and add to the attractiveness of the overall scheme. And finally, each property would have a private garden, enclosed in the most part with fencing, some with brick feature walls, and others with hedging and fencing.

Residents discussed a number of points concerning the proposed development. Would the character of the village change and could the village's infrastructure (including our road system) cope with an additional 40 houses? Would the proposed access from Cley Hill Gardens be safe? Would planning permission be given as the site is outside the village's 'building line' and in the light of Wiltshire Council's Core Strategy document which envisages only a small amount of housing development taking place between now and 2026 in the

Warminster Rural area.

On the positive side, the prospect of affordable housing being made available in the village looked attractive. More voungsters of primary school age living in the village might help secure the long-term future of the school and the possibility of mains gas reaching the village would be enhanced. Also, if the development went ahead, a certain amount of cash (known as Section 106 funds) would be made available to fund community projects. This might be used to tackle some of the traffic issues in Chapmanslade and Mr Haia offered the services of his transport consultants to work on this.

The overall feeling of the meeting was that the development would be welcomed in the village. The parish council resolved, despite the concerns mentioned above, to work alongside Lochailort by offering advice and to help tackle the various issues which had been raised.

We will keep you closely in touch with progress in the coming months. In the meantime we would welcome your views on the proposals. Please don't hesitate to get in touch with us or do come along to our next meetina.

Planning

At the time of writing, we are still waiting to learn whether Wiltshire Council has agreed to give planning permission to the owners of Thoulstone Park for temporary permission (ref 14/10453/FUL) to store 8 touring caravans and residential occupation of a further 5 caravans to be housed in the area of the former golf driving range. We objected to the proposal as have a significant number of local residents.

Thoulstone Wind Turbine

(Ref 14/08778/FUL). We now understand that a decision on this controversial application can be expected by the end of April. The developers have been given an extension until the end of February to respond to some of the concerns raised in the period of consultation and we believe we will be given the opportunity to see their response, and hopefully comment on it. before a final decision is taken.

Sienna's Valley

(Ref 14/09500/FUL). The Western Area Planning Committee considered a retrospective and controversial application for a static caravan on the site at its meeting on 17th December. At the meeting, several local residents challenged the Planning Officer's recommendation (which was based on advice provided by Wiltshire Council's agricultural consultant) that it was essential for someone to be on site for 24 hours each day to care for a herd of alpacas. The committee deferred a decision until a later date so that the planning officers could consider the evidence presented. At the time of writing, we are waiting to find out when the matter will return to committee.

Footpath 12

At its December meeting the Western Area Plannina Committee also considered the recently published order concerning the diversion of footpath 12 (Dye House Farm). An objection to the proposed order had been lodged by a member of the public and, despite assurances given by Wiltshire's Rights of Way offficers, was not withdrawn. The parish council and a number of village residents had offered their support for the diversion, which is already being used by walkers, to their satisfaction. The committee's only option was to refer the

matter to central government's Planning Inspectorate, A planning inspector will consider and will prepare a report for Eric Pickles, Secretary of State for Communities, who will reach a decision in due course (and at not-inconsiderable expense to the taxpayer).

53 High Street

(Ref14/11797/FUL). We considered an application to build 2 four-bedroomed houses in the garden of no 53 High Street. A number of residents living in the immediate area were present and voiced their objections. We decided to object to the proposal, on the basis that the potential increased traffic to the development would create an additional safety hazard. This is in an area where on street parking either side of this proposed access is already raising serious safety concerns for traffic passing through the village, access from Wood Lane and access to and from Huntenhull Lane as well as access from adjacent properties and those opposite the proposed access. The existing poor visibility at this proposed access would be further limited by the continuous and hazardous on road parking in this area and would increase the potential of serious accidents in this area. We also considered that the proposed design for the development is not in keeping with the surrounding dwellings and is overbearing for the site. Accordingly we have asked Fleur de Rhe Phillipe, our Wiltshire Councillor, to call the application in so that the planning committee can consider it if the officers recommend approval.

2015-16 Precept

We confirmed that our precept for 2015-2016 should be £4,390.51 which, together with Wiltshire Council's top-up grant of £109.49, means that our income next year

will be £4,500. We are not a high-spending authority: the majority of our expenditure is to support the village hall, which annually receives £3,100.

Defibrillator

A number of volunteers have come forward to offer help as voluntary 'wardens' of the defibrillator, which we expect will be installed in February. We still need to raise funds to pay towards the cost of the defibrillator scheme and all suggestions and further offers of help will be much appreciated. Once the machine is in place we will invite you to an event where we show you how it works and how it can be of benefit to our village.

Mains Gas

We are rapidly approaching the 59 households needed before Wales and West can proceed.

Highways

The hole in the road outside Clearwood View is due to be repaired again in the near future. There's no news yet of Southcroft getting back into the schedule for resurfacing. Recent road traffic accidents in the village underline the importance of the Community Speedwatch scheme and our efforts to put pressure on Wiltshire Council to come up with initiatives to calm traffic speeds in the High Street. In this respect we were dismayed to learn that the council has withdrawn funding for Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs), which are another means of slowing down the traffic.

And finally...

Congratulations to Nigel Bridewell who, along with a distant cousin, performed the re-opening ceremony at James Dredge's



Tales from the passenger seat



There have been occasions when I have been able to identify an underlying medical or other problem that the pupil is not aware of. This doesn't mean that I am some kind of Sherlock Holmes doctor in the car, but I do have some examples that proved useful to the pupils in question.

I was teaching two ladies, one was 49, the other 52. Neither knew each other. but both started around the same time. Now generally speaking, steering a car is a bit like riding a bike or learning to swim, once you have reached a certain standard, you don't get worse. There might be the odd individual "Oops", but the severe 'wobble, wobble, veer all over the road' action that some learners do initially. does not re-occur. You don't ride a bike or swim, then suddenly fall off continually, or sink, unless there is something wrong... By coincidence both these ladies reverted back to abysmal steering in the same week. They also complained they were bumping into things when at home, feeling tired, off balance and their muscles aching during a lesson. I suggested to both ladies that they should consider a visit to the doctor. Next lesson both explained that they had been diagnosed with an underactive thyroid aland. Suitable treatment in place, normality resumed almost immediately.

Many pupils will mention they have dyslexia when I first meet them . Fine, nice to know.

I can then understand the different learning process required, and make adjustments to my lessons. Sometimes a pupil will not tell me. They may not realise that it can have a direct effect on their learning to drive. It doesn't prevent a successful outcome, but it often means that situations requiring fast, judgemental and/or multi-tasking types of decisions, can be more difficult to start with. If I am suspicious that a pupil may be dyslexic there are a number of questions I casually ask during a lesson that, depending on the answers, gives me a good indication whether my suspicions were justified.

There have been times when a pupil has been totally unaware that they are dyslexic. A little while ago I had such a case, where neither the school nor the parents had identified any problem, yet all the signs were there. He was a lad who was perfectly happy to discuss all manner of things, so broaching the subject was no problem. He was more than happy to agree that taking an appropriate test would be a good idea, especially since it was February and he was due to take his A Levels that summer. His parents arranged for the school to conduct a test, which confirmed he most certainly was dyslexic, the very happy outcome being he was given a special laptop programme to assist his studies as well as being allowed extra exam time; he also passed his A levels - a great result!

Countryside Matters

Is Britain no longer a land of milk and honey? How times have changed...

It is of great concern to dairy farmers that one of the large milk buyers has been unable to pay its producers for the milk supplied in December. Since the mid-1930s when the Milk Marketing Board (MMB) was set up, dairy farmers have been guaranteed payment for the milk they produced. During the 1970s the MMB, was disbanded and farmers were given the opportunity to find their own milk buyer, but were then given a guota for the amount of milk they could produce.

After the foot and mouth disease outbreak of 2001 when many herds were slaughtered, a lot of farmers gave up the 24 hours a

day, 365 days a year job of looking after milking cows; decidina

That milkmaid's lot is better than mine, and her life merrier. Elizabeth I kites swoop down

instead to retire, produce beef or sheep, or plough up the land for cereal crops.

Since then the British dairy farmer has been unable to supply enough fresh milk to meet the demands of the food suppliers. Supermarkets then found European and world producers of dairy products such as dried and processed milk for manufacturing, subsidised cheese and butter, and have used milk as a loss-leader to entice the food buyer into the supermarket.

Over the last two years many milk producers have been selling milk for less than it costs

to produce. Milk costs, on average, 30p per litre to produce: the farmer receives around 20p per litre, whilst the supermarkets charge you 50p per litre. The British dairy industry as we know it is in real trouble. Where will our fresh milk-based food products come from in years to come?

You would imagine that our countryside is quiet and dormant in February, but this is not so. The skies in the early morning are alive with the crow family (mainly rooks, carrion crows and jackdaws) leaving their roosting perches to find food in the fields. The Canada geese fly over in formation from local ponds to the lakes and adjacent

> — feeding areas. Buzzards, and increasinaly, red to pick up small

mammals, especially those annoying rabbits. Meanwhile our winter visitors, the redwings and fieldfares are joining resident finches to enjoy the last of our berries and seeds. The woodpeckers are drumming away in the woods and the cock pheasants call to say they are still around – how lovely they all look.

The willow trees are bursting with fluffy buds, hazel catkins sway in the wind and underneath, on the banks, are the wonderful snowdrops. The long winter nights will soon be behind us, so let's make the most of each Judith Helliar season.



No news is good news

In a lecture on positive psychology, I heard that people who don't listen to or watch the news

frequently are less likely to be depressed or unhappy than people who do. There isn't room here to unpack the arguments about causal and correlational links (and you'll probably be glad of that) but it's an interesting idea. And there can be little doubt that the vast majority of the headlines concern awful events occurring around the world.

Should we just switch off, then, and block out the unpleasantness?

If we did that, we'd be uninformed about current affairs and in no position to comment or act upon things that we feel deserve a response of some kind; we'd become disengaged. But when the picture of the world is so unrelentingly dismal, we can start to feel enraged and impotent; hopeless. It's easy then fail to register hope, joy and strength in ourselves and others. We're beleaguered on two fronts: the outside world is arim and so are we and there's nothing we can do about it

So a little balance may be useful. Some people take time to notice the good things around and within them and some of those people write them down; in a notebook or on scraps of paper that they put into a jar so that they can watch the stock of good things grow. Some people acknowledge that there is darkness in the world and try to bring a little light into their own corner of it to alleviate their own suffering and that of others. Some

just choose to switch off the news, say, once or twice a week and do something else instead - read a good book, meditate, walk, ring a friend and so on. These acts of recharging our emotional batteries allow us to be more resilient and can even bestow upon us the energy to engage more powerfully in a bid to make a difference.
