Update on the new shared ownership homes at **Maud Davies Close, Corsley**



At the recent PC meeting, officers from Wiltshire Council presented an update on the development at Maud Davies Close

and answered questions from councillors and members of the public who were present. The key points were:

- Availability would probably be in the spring (March)
- · It was confirmed that with limited exceptions, Corsley residents would get priority when it came to allocation.
- The rent for the four two-bedroom houses would be £304 per month plus £11 per month for sewage management.
- · The rent for the three-bedroom house would be f,336 per month plus f,11 for sewage management.
- The shared ownership would be based on a valuation of £230,000.
- · As yet, the Council tax banding has not been set.

The Wiltshire Council officers encouraged anyone interested in renting or shared ownership to apply **promptly** as the time taken to process enrolment was 11 weeks.

It was proposed that an unveiling ceremony be held once the homes were handed over to the council. This was welcomed by the PC.

Post-meeting clarifications:

Corsley residents' eligibility assessment applications

When the prospective shared ownership residents have applied, please let Rachael Swann - Residential Development Project Officer know and she will speak with the Lettings team to see if there is any additional assistance that can be provided. Nothing can be promised but they will try to progress matters.

Water meters

The homes will have water meters, and they will be charged at Wessex Water's standard rate.

Property documentation

Home User Guides will be available in every home supplying required information about the property and important contacts. This will include information in respect of the solar panels.

Council Tax

We have been informed that the bandings will be applied when the properties have been handed over to Wiltshire Council from the developer. Applicants will be advised as soon as the bandings are available.

Help To Buy ISA

The independent financial advisor who assesses participants interested in shared ownership, has confirmed that the government savings account 'Help to Buy ISA' can be used towards the purchasing of shared ownership shares.







Six Open Doors

Dear Friends,

As we move into the second month of the year, we find ourselves already planning for Lent which begins on Wednesday 5th March. It is always a challenge for us to keep pace with the progress in the story of the life of Jesus from Christmas to Easter. February begins with the celebration of his presentation at the temple in Jerusalem, which was a duty for Jewish parents as he was their first born son. As they arrived at the Temple, Mary and Joseph were met by a very old man named Simeon; he was a holy man and was noted as a very intelligent scholar. There are many newer translations of his words, but this from the Revised Standard Version of the Bible provides a rich insight into Christ's future life of mission. As Simeon gathered Jesus up in his arms and blessed God he said "Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word; for mine eyes have seen thy salvation, which thou hast prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to thy people Israel."

These words were nothing short of revolutionary, especially when spoken in the Temple. Simeon was predicting the breaking down of the barriers which surrounded the Jewish faith at that time and what would follow in the years from then until Jesus began his final journey to the cross. The month of February allows us time to remember all the amazing stories which describe how he brought God's message of love and peace to all, regardless of race, religion or gender.

During this month, both parishes in the Cley Hill Villages Benefice are continuing the journey towards finding a new Rector. An advertisement went out last month accompanied by a profile, which describes who we are looking for in our new priest and an insight into the life of the church in our villages. This profile can be found on the Salisbury Diocese website https://www.salisbury.anglican.org/vacancies/clergy-vacancies. The job title is Rector and Village Church Missioner, which carries a message in itself, as we look towards a new chapter in our mission to breathe new life into our relationship with all in our community including the village parishes which surround Westbury, Warminster and Mere. Applications for the vacancy will be closing on 18th of this month and shortlisting will take place on 25th. Interviews will be taking place on 24th and 25th March. These will include representatives from both the Diocese and Parishes.

Please come along to Chapmanslade Church at 10 am on Sunday 9th February to hear more from Church Buildings Community Enabler, Toni Bush, who is helping us develop our churches as part of our overall mission effort. As we pray for a successful end to the search for our new priest, Simeon's words echo as we look forward to the arrival of a new team guide and adviser to help us reveal Christ's message of light, love and hope in both existing and new ways, which reflect what you, our diverse community demands in the 21st century.

Parish Council Briefing

Round-up of the PC's activity in January

Herewith the main issues from the meeting held on the 13th January

In addition to the councillors present, there were a number of members of the public and officers from Wiltshire Council who gave a presentation on the development at Maud Davies Close.

PC response to Wiltshire consultation on the Local Transport Plan (LPT4)

Following a detailed discussion it was agree that Councillor should summarise the PC response and circulate for comment prior to submission by the deadline of 24th January.

The discussion also covered the letter received from parishioners regarding the speed limit at Lane End and it was agreed that our LPT4 response should cover Lane End as well as a number of other locations in the village to address this issue.

Planning

Planning Application no Pl/2024/10606 -Permission In Principle (PIP) for a phased development of up to two self-build dwellings at land at Lane End, Corsley had been refused by the planning authority. (The PC had previously agreed they would have no objection to this application subject to certain conditions.) The application had been refused because:

• The proposed development, because of its location and proposed land use, would be located in an unsustainable location which would result in the future occupiers being reliant on private vehicles to access services

- and facilities. The development therefore conflicts with the aims of the spatial strategy of the Wiltshire Core Strategy.
- The Council's SFRA indicates that the site is at risk of high ground water levels and no site-specific FRA has been submitted which would mitigate the risk of groundwater flooding.

Finance – precept for 2025/2026

Following discussion, the PC confirmed the decision made at the previous meeting that the precept should be increased by 5% on the 2024/2025 total

Streetscene

A report had been circulated by Councillor Ball. The Speed Indicator Device (SID) had been damaged during the recent storms. Following discussion it was agreed that the PC should try to effect a repair before returning it to the supplier for them to repair. There was some discussion about getting a second SID.

It was reported that there are still a number of outstanding issues that the PC is trying to resolve; flooding at Sturford Lane and overgrown hedges.

Rights of Way

Councillor Helliar gave a verbal report. Improvements have been made to CORY 3. CORY 8 and 10 would be improved over the next six months. A few landowners are being chased for stile and gate repairs. The CORY 7 diversion is still awaiting another bridge survey from Somerset Council.

AOB

The Chair reported that the mobile Police van would be at the Royal Oak on the 17th January.

The Chair also reported that he had cut down one of the birch trees on the Birchwood Close island for safety reasons. It is probable that the remainder of the birch trees will have to be cut down for similar reasons in time as the trees are at the end of their normal life span. It was suggested that the residents of Birchwood Close be advised of this and be consulted on what trees should replace them.

Date of Next meeting

The date of the next meeting is 3rd March. Feel free to join us. (Assuming that there is no change because of central government decisions regarding re-organisation this will probably be the last meeting of the current Parish Council before the elections in May.)



Additional £22m investment in our roads

As your Wiltshire Councillor I am most often asked about our roads - so I thought it might be helpful to write about Wiltshire Council's investment in our roads, and how it prioritises spending.

Wiltshire Council is focused on efficient and effective financial management - with prevention and early intervention in all service areas from adults and children's services to roads. An extra £22m has been invested into Wiltshire's highways - on top of the f.20.7m received from the Government - and it is making a difference on the county's roads, with more resurfacing, more repairs and fewer potholes.

Highways expenditure and performance is scrutinised intensely – including by the Environment Select Committee at its meeting on 14 January. All Highways investment follows an evidence-led, risk-based approach - i.e. the inspection regime determines the risk to motorists and residents. Residents may be interested to read more at Agenda -Democratic Services - Wiltshire Council Item 7.

The Inspection Manual and the planned Highways Maintenance Programme by Area Board are on the Wiltshire Council website at Highways maintenance - Wiltshire Council. I'm pleased that the Warminster Area Board maintenance plan includes Chapmanslade – Thoulstone A36 on/off slips and Huntenhull Green (2025/6)

Smaller target sites most prone to potholes are repaired through a package of road resurfacing and localised repairs using new machines called Bobcats. These remove and replace large patches of road in a matter of minutes, before moving straight on to the next job. Areas are identified through analysis of customer reports, pothole repairs and local knowledge of areas of concern from the Local Highways Area Engineers. Special consideration will be given to C road and Unclassified roads so please do use the My Wilts app to report any local issues.

Much of the additional investment would not be possible without the Council's careful financial management to free up additional funds for these priorities, and of course significant hard work by Highways Officers to manage the programmes and contractors.

But there is much more to be done, as we continue to invest significant sums into filling and preventing potholes, replacing and extending the life of our road surfaces, preventing flooding, replacing road signs and reinstating and painting new road markings.

I will continue to keep you updated on the Highways Investment plans and programmes as more becomes available.

"Speak, for your servant is listening." 1 Samuel, 3:9

We need to listen!

Are you a good listener? Have you ever considered that there is a real difference between hearing and listening? Most of us do the former, but maybe not so much the latter. Certainly, as a man of a certain age,

I find that I am accused regularly of hearing but not listening. I am told research has found that we hear between 20,000 and 30,000 words a day. You could argue, therefore, that it's not unreasonable that we don't listen to all of them; although I find that argument doesn't wash most of the time!

It's important, isn't it, that we do listen, to take in information that's being passed onto us?

The Dictionary defines listening as "to hear something with thoughtful attention"

In the Bible, there are many accounts of people listening to God speaking and obeying. One was the boy Samuel, who was sleeping in the Temple and heard a voice speaking. He initially thought it was the old priest Eli, but then understood that it was God. Samuel says "Speak, for your servant is listening". God reveals His plan to Samuel. Later we are told that "The Lord was with Samuel as he grew up", and none of his words were ever wasted.

You know God still speaks today, but we need to listen. He speaks to us through His Creation, the changing seasons all around us. He speaks through His servants, as they preach in churches up and down our land. You could go and hear one on a Sunday at a Chapel like Whitbourne, maybe. Many churches now share these messages online (if you aren't sure where to go, search

for churches that are affiliated to

the Evangelical Alliance or the Fellowship of Independent

> Evangelical Churches and you will find plenty to listen to). It's important that we both hear and listen to what God has to say to us.

Jesus said "I tell you the truth, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be condemned" (John 5 v24).

Let us be listeners too.



Mid January brought a week of snow and ice and -2/-4 degrees daytime temperatures. This brought extra challenges on the farm, with field and building pipes freezing up and the road from the farm to the main road needing clearing of snow and then gritting so the milk tanker could get in and out from the farm for the daily collections. This cold spell of


weather was unusual in that it came from the south and was very localised.

I was fortunate to see the sheep being given their daily supplements early one morning when a hard frost was still on the ground. The shepherd and his trusty border collie had moved them into a field near the house as their lambing days are getting closer and their final injection before their lambing day is due. The picture

I saw was the quad bike making an ever increasing circle with a bag of sheep nuts slowly emptying and the sheep quickly eating the food on the white frosty ground, leaving a trail of wheel marks and small footprints in a beautiful circle.

Sadly, the crisp dry days were replaced by cold damp days and the forecast for the end of January was for extremely high winds so, once again, we had to 'batten down the hatches'.

At least February is our shortest month with just 28 days, with the daylight hours slowly lengthening.



Dusk is the best time to see hundreds, if not thousands, of starlings moving like clouds (murmurations) before they land on their safe cover for the night. If

you are willing to travel, the best local area to see these nightly murmurations are at the RSPB nature reserve at Ham Wall on the Somerset Levels.

Although spring is still quite a way off, the tawny owls are nesting - the female calls 'twit'



and the male responds with 'twoo'. You might also hear the spring call of the thrush and our native blackbird. An early call at this time of year is that of the fox, a call that is not a bark or a sound you could mistake for any other animal, even if you live near Longleat!

Sadly, a day- and night-time sport enjoyed by some ne'er-do-wells, is hare coursing; greyhounds and lurchers are trained to chase and kill hares which is an illegal activity. Sadly, these people have no respect for the law and often appear to be kind owners of retired racing greyhounds. Do report anyone you see allowing a dog to chase hares, or any other animal, to the police - these people have little or no respect for animals, humans or the law.

As the arable crops start to appear, you may be fortunate to see the hares 'boxing'; this usually occurs when a male is being too persistent with a female, chasing her across fields in an attempt to mate. When she's had enough, she'll turn around and try to fend him off in a fierce boxing match! This behaviour can go on for weeks.

Enjoy your walks in the countryside when you can - there's plenty to see and hear but, for your own safety, please do wear clothing that can be seen by drivers, especially early morning or dusk and even in dull and wet weather.
