



Biology: changing the world


What do food labels mean?

A reader has asked if I can explain some of the science behind food labelling, found on packets and jars sold in the UK.

There are two types of labelling, a voluntary nutritional outline of the contents (including the "traffic light" system) and an obligatory list of ingredients in order of quantity. The first is to allow you to keep an eye on your intake of fats, sugars and salt, in particular, and the second is more specific to provide information for people with allergies, other medical conditions or who just want to know what is present in prepared foodstuffs.

So, why is the information useful? The nutritional information typically gives the content in terms of Energy, Fats (including Saturated Fats), Carbohydrates (including Sugars), Protein and Salt. These are set against the "Adult Reference Intakes", which are the amounts recommended each day for an average-sized woman doing an average amount of physical activity. These are: Energy 2000kcal; Fat 70g (Saturates 20a), Carbohydrates 260a (Total Sugars 90g), Protein 50g, Salt 6g. Adding up the separate components on the foodstuffs you eat allows you to control your recommended daily intake. The traffic light system provides an easy way of telling whether a food is particularly high or low in each component. However, be careful in your calculations; some of the "average serving" quantities given on the package are very small!

The information is also useful if you have specific dietary requirements. For example,



as a diabetic, one can eat carbohydrates but the amount of sugar needs to be controlled. Carbohydrates include sugars and starchy foods. Total sugars come from both natural sources, such as fructose in fruit, and added sugar, such as sucrose (domestic sugar) or glucose. Although cellulose from vegetables is chemically a carbohydrate, humans cannot digest it, and it is normally referred to as fibre and not included in the total carbohydrate content.

Fats are recorded as total fat and as saturated fats. Fat provides a large number of calories for its weight, and reducing fat in a diet is important in avoiding obesity. Unfortunately, fat also carries a lot of flavour and low-fat foods often have higher sugar content to improve the flavour. Saturated fat is particularly problematic as it is likely to cause an increase in cholesterol concentrations and through that an increase in the risk of heart disease and stroke. Some obesity experts have recently spoken out against low-fat, high carbohydrate diets in favour of a balanced diet. The advice you receive is often confusing!

The amount of salt (sodium chloride) is usually given and it is worth remembering that the recommended daily intake of salt is 6g, exactly one teaspoon full. Sometimes this is just given as sodium and 2.4a of sodium is equivalent to 6g salt. High salt intake raises blood pressure which may give heart problems and lead to stroke. A lot of salt is present in foods, and it is claimed that we eat far too much salt in the UK.

Finally, protein and often fibre are recorded. By and large these are positive components of food. Protein provides a lot of the necessary components for building a healthy body and fibre helps ensure a healthy gut.

Obviously, individuals may suffer allergies to the particular protein component, such as in nut allergy, or other components, such as gluten (a carbohydrate) in coeliac disease. Specific foods need to be avoided completely in such cases. For the rest of us, sensible portions of a balanced diet should suffice.



Parish Council Briefing

Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the PCs activity in June

The third quarterly meeting of the PC took place on the 6th June. The major item was a very frank and open update from Bob Montgomery, Longleat CEO, on the plans for the Elton John concert on 12th June and the 'inside' story of Longleat's involvement with the Eavis family and the Glastonbury Festival. The PC also considered four planning applications and received updates on regular topics. There were about thirty members of the public at the meeting.

Longleat events

Elton John concert

By the time you read this report, the concert will be history. The traffic management plans revealed by Bob Montgomery appeared to have worked successfully. Clearly the A362 was busy with concert traffic travelling to the various parking sites and exit traffic from the 40-acre site car park though Lane End, the only Corsley area directly affected by the concert other than the A362, queued at the A362 junction but rapidly cleared.

Glastonbury Festival

Longleat had first been approached by Mr Eavis in the autumn of 2015 and asked if they would be interested in hosting Glastonbury at some time in the future. Right now, Longleat has neither said yes nor ruled it out. For Longleat, whilst they might be interested, they would not contemplate any risk to their brand, the heritage site,

the animals, their burgeoning cultural reputation and all the other things that Longleat conjures up. If they did agree then the very earliest it would occur would be 2019, not the 2018 that of the press are reporting. It should not be assumed that an event at Longleat would be on the same scale as Glastonbury or directly mirror the style of its performances. Some exploratory work has been done and the Longleat team are planning to visit this year's Glastonbury Festival to further their understanding of what the implications would be. Based on the work they have done so far it is estimated that to accommodate a "Glastonbury" they would have to close the Lonaleat estate for at least a month. Such a decision would have to be very seriously thought through and the benefits to Longleat in so doing would have to be significant before such a measure would be considered.

There was a Q&A session on both events covering a variety of aspects:

Planning timescales

Bob advised that Longleat have, as yet, no plans on what the timescales might be for further discussions re Glastonbury. Beyond their visit to the festival it is unlikely that there will be any advances until this year's festival is done and dusted – it could well be autumn before any further discussions take place.

Wiltshire Council involvement

Bob further advised that, following the initial approach, Longleat had consulted with Wiltshire Council and their response had been positive.

Longleat reputation

Bob stressed that Longleat would only entertain the idea if it was felt that the Longleat brand would be enhanced, i.e. if the national and international coverage would broaden the existing reputation and to this end a 'one-off' event would probably not be very attractive to them.

Risks

The audience gave RM their views on the significant risks to Longleat, with a general view that a Glastonbury-style event could be very destructive to both Longleat's reputation and materially. In particular, Mike Butler (Old Mill Accountants) offered his experience of Glastonbury, through representation of local landowners, relating to the extent of the logistics involved, the damage to the land, the impact on the farming businesses and the risks that these all posed to Longleat if they went ahead with the idea. It's one thing holding such an event on open farmland where the land could be left fallow immediately after the event. It's quite another holding it on a heritage site with ongoing public access and with all the health and safety issues that involved. The logistics of the festival are immense and Glastonbury have had years to get it right. Whilst fans are happy to go to such events very few would like to live alongside them.

Planning applications

16/04438/FUL

Conversion of first floor offices back into flats. White Horse Motor Company, Cavallino House, Corsley Heath

The first floor of this building is currently used as business space – offices, meeting rooms, stores, etc. It had been flats in the past and this application is to convert the first floor back to three two-bedroom flats. Access would be from the NE corner of the building via stairs and a walkway along the flat roof, which would be decked for sitting out and edged with a continuous planter and box hedging on the north side. The garage's rear car park would be partitioned, giving an area for the garage business needs separated from a parking area for six cars to service the flats.

The PC had no issues on the conversion itself, which would have no detrimental material effect on the external appearance of the building and the potential provision accommodation in Corsley is welcome. However, there was concern over the parking arrangements. The area adjacent to the garage, around the eastbound bus stop, is already regularly crowded, often with vehicles associated with the garage business, and the planned parking arrangements for the new flats reduces the area available to the garage and could be an exacerbating factor. The layout chosen also seems to be inefficient use of the land available.

The council agreed to support this application subject to the condition that the six parking spaces shown as allocated to the flats be used only for this purpose.

16/03787/FUL

Change of use of existing outbuilding to holiday let at Glencourt Farm, 90 Lyes Green, Corsley.

Glencourt has recently had a major renovation and this application concerns the remaining unaltered outbuilding. previously used as a garage and workshop. It is in poor condition. The application is to

renovate and convert this building into a single storey one bedroom holiday let with parking for two cars.

It was agreed to support this application subject to the condition that the building in question may be used only as a holiday let and never as a separate permanent dwelling.

16/03155/FUL

Demolition of existing conservatory and construction of new single storey rear extension to provide dining room and external store at 2 Heathway, Corsley.

It was agreed to support this application.

16/04198/VAR

Variation of condition at Squires Coal Services, Lane End

Changes in national legislation had altered the environmental sustainability conditions relevant to the design and construction of the two detached houses on the old coal vard site. The application is for removal of conditions previously imposed under the changed Act.

The PC registered no objection to this application.

Bay Tree Close

Various communications had been received by the PC giving details of the developing plans for social housing at Bay Tree Close:

Sewage disposal

To date, Wiltshire are maintaining their stance that Wessex Water will "not allow" the new development to take advantage of the outflow from the existing Bay Tree Close sewage plant and also believe that the proposed solution is the most economical. Discussions are continuing and the PC now has contacts in Wessex Water which will be pursued.

Bus Stops

As previously reported, Highways seem to be happy to put two new bus stops outside the entrance to Bay Tree Close and also to improve the refuge in the middle of the road by making it bigger

Footpath

A solution for access to the Heath has been proposed which envisages a footpath across the western edge of the show field from a point just east of the Bay Tree Close entrance, joining the existing path across the field from Heathway to Park Barn Farm. This is subject to negotiation with the landowner.

Speed Limit

The original assessment of the speed limit along the A362 has been re-examined by Wiltshire and their judgement is that the new development at Bay Tree Close does not alter the conclusion that a reduction from 40mph to 30mph is not justified.

Streetscene

Simon Jasper updated the PC on three issues:

Parish Steward

The details of the 'new' scheme are not yet clear, but Wiltshire have offered a meeting to provide further insight and the details will be reported in the next edition of The Bridge and on the website. Despite the impending re-introduction of the Parish Steward, it was still vital that problems on the ground be reported on CLARENCE and the MYWILTS app. If a problem is not reported it does exist!

Geys Hill passing space

This is finally scheduled to be done in January 2017. Information regarding any traffic restrictions this may cause will be reported nearer the time.

Speed limit Lyes Green

The speed limit signs through Lyes Green will be installed during June/July 2016. A map of locations for the repeater signs had been provided by Wiltshire and some modifications were discussed to reduce the likelihood of farm vehicles damaging the signs. These will be forwarded to Wiltshire. Painted road-markers had been discussed in the past, but it is currently not Wiltshire Council's policy to use them, mainly for economic reasons

Broadband

The details of the additional modelling referred to in last month's edition of The Bridge have now been received and are under close scrutiny by Hugh Deed, Neil Carpenter and myself, so that we can try and work out an optimum scheme for any extension of the links to fibre and faster broadband speeds.

However, as I hoped to make clear last month, there are two key points to emphasise here. First, any costs associated with such extensions are outside the government-funded programme. They would have to be borne by so-called community funding schemes, under current policy, but before any schemes are exposed to the village, the potential for alternative funding avenues will be explored. Second, the extensions examined will not necessarily put the broadband speeds into the realms of "superfast", but could offer the chance of considerable improvements over the current service.

Accounts

The PC accounts for 2015/16 were tabled and accepted. They will now be forwarded for formal audit and published on The Bridge website.



Dear Friends,

Last Friday I had an absolutely wonderful day off. We usually go out somewhere if only for change of scene that more often than not involves coffee and cake. No cake on this particular day but there was a distinct yumminess about it as we went to see the litter of Labradoodle puppies we have had our name down for and chose the new addition to our family. Needless to say Alfie and I have been having long chats about the proceedings but he adores other dogs so I am sure he will enjoy having a new friend. Naming the new addition to the family has proved interesting and text messages have been flying back and forth across the Atlantic, the Mediterranean, to Putney and Winchester as the whole family have proffered suggestions.

Names are really important aren't they and it's interesting to see the waxing and waning of the most popular names. Knowing someone's name immediately alters the nature of our relationship with them, our perception of them is changed; they are no longer a faceless homogenous other, they are living breathing human beings just like us.

When the baby church was coming into being in the century after Jesus's death and resurrection they had to work out what it meant to be a follower of Christ, or The Way, as they called it. St Paul wrote some great letters to a number of those churches encouraging them and helping them, because just like our church today, we get it wrong sometimes, well we get it wrong a lot of the time to be honest, because we are human and humans lives are messy. Some of Paul's writing can be a bit convoluted, but now and again he comes out with a real gem. In his letter to the Galatians he writes: 'There is no longer Jew nor Greek, no longer slave nor free, there is no longer male nor female, for we are all one in Christ Jesus.'

We are, every one of us, a child of God, this it what it means to be human. And it gets even better; God knows each and everyone of us human beings by name. In the book of the prophet Isaiah we read:

But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;

I have called you by name, you are mine.

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour.

The above passage doesn't promise that nothing bad will ever happen to us, and goodness knows we've seen some terrible acts of violence these last weeks, but it does promise that nothing can take away this incredibly intimate relationship we have with God. How extraordinary, that God who created the cosmos knows you and me, by name.

I want to name someone now who has been a wonderful inspiration and help to many. Revd Di Britten's last service will be at Horningsham church on Sunday 31st July at 10.30 am followed by a 'bring and share' lunch at the village hall. Please come and help celebrate the wonderful way in which Di has served our parishes during her ministry here and to offer our thanks for all she has given us.

Jobs for July

Although July could prove a busy month with lots of jobs to be done in the garden, don't forget to sit back and relax, enjoying all your hard work and effort!

- Water thoroughly once or twice a week to encourage plants to put down their roots, rather than coming to the surface for water. In warm, dry weather, water containers and hanging baskets every day
- Dead-head roses and bedding plants to encourage further flowering
- Protect fruit bushes from birds by placing netting over them
- Pests love warm weather, so keep your eye out!
- Continue to tie and train new growth into climbers
- Look out for 'clematis wilt' wilting leaves and discolouration – simply cut out affected leaves
- When cutting the lawn, set the blades slightly higher
- Keep bird baths topped up in warm weather
- Regularly pick french beans, runner beans and courgettes to encourage further cropping
- Pick, dry and freeze herbs for using later in the vear
- Clear weeds regularly or they will compete with your crops for water and nutrients
- Cut lavender flowers and hang them to dry
- Keep the pond topped up with water and clear any blanket weed or algae
- Place conservatory plants outside now that it's getting warmer
- Take advantage of the dry weather and catch up on any painting jobs.

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Phil Jefferson reports on the parish council's activities in June

The parish council met once, on 9th June. Our agenda was lighter than in recent months.

Planning applications

16/02522/FUL

Reversion of The Retreat/82 High Street, from a single to two dwellings with associated car parking. Erection of carport and pool building.

The owner has submitted a revised planning application, which varies only in minor detail from the earlier application. We raised no objection to the application.

16/02791/FUL

Proposed rear two storey extension and single storey extension, 72 High Street.

Wiltshire Council has now approved this application, with conditions.

16/05148/LBC

Security works involving new fence and secure foyer at Chapmanslade CE VA School.

We will be considering this application at our July meeting.

Barters Farm proposals

We have learned that there will be no decision yet, possibly not for a further twelve months.

Village plan

This will be the main item for discussion at our July meeting. If you are interested in participating in putting together a village plan, do come along or get in touch with us.

Highways

Our MP, Andrew Murrison, has written, on our behalf, to the Secretary of State for Transport, who has yet to respond, and to Wiltshire's Cabinet Member for Highways. So far we are making little progress in persuading the authorities that we need a 7.5 tonne weight limit through the village. We decided that we should ask for a meeting with Fleur de Rhé-Philipe, our Wiltshire councillor, and the appropriate officer from the Highways department. We will keep you posted.

There seems little chance that the road surface through the village will be brought up to standard in the near future. We have requested that the road markings and white lines should be refreshed but we have learned that the parish council would be expected to pay 25% towards the cost of this.

The road safety group has not met recently. However, an officer from Wiltshire Council's Highways Department is due to meet parish councillors shortly to discuss road safety issues.

Community Speedwatch

Once again, our speedwatch volunteers conducted several sessions last month. Taking advantage of the light mornings and evenings we carried out several checks at 7.30 am and at 5 pm. On a Friday evening over 600 vehicles passed through the village in one hour. Several motorists were clocked at speeds in excess of 40 mph, one of them at 48 mph whilst the school was in session. He will receive a visit at his home by a police officer. We have some new volunteers in the pipeline. 



Tales from the passenger seat



It can be quite common that when a pupil first experiences reversing, they are sometimes uncertain which way to move the wheel. It's not a problem - I have strategies to employ so pupils immediately understand what they need to do. What is rarer, is the pupil who does not understand which way to move the wheel when going forwards! I don't mean those that initially wobble about and veer here and there... I'm talking about not understanding that if you move forwards and move the wheel to the left, the car will actually go to the left! It is pretty rare, but I had a pupil ask me about it a little while ago and it reminded me of an previous pupil who simply could not grasp the concept.

I had also explained the difference between the views in the interior and door mirrors. The latter are convex and the image is quite distorted so, although a wider field of vision is displayed, it can be difficult to assess the speed or distance of traffic coming from behind. Interior mirrors are much flatter so the image is much more true to life. This same pupil genuinely asked whether the view from out of a window is better or worse than when looking in the door mirrors...

Speed and distance are subjective rather than objective decisions and, whilst the ability to judge them accurately varies

considerably from person to person, it can be taught. Nevertheless, there are certain situation that, on the surface, would appear to be rather obvious: once, during a lesson with another pupil, we were driving along in a line of traffic doing a steady 50mph. The pupil asked me "Are we doing the same speed as the cars in front?" "Yes"

"We can't be, because they are in front of us so they must be going faster..."

Later on, in the evening when following cars with their lights on, the same pupil asked "How come he's driving all the time with his brake lights on?"

Although I am asked all sorts of questions about learning to drive, it's important to remember is that a professional answer is always the proper response. Although I write about some funny, but thankfully rare incidents, I never make fun of anyone or identify them.

The joy of instructing is to not only teach those who find learning easy, but also to be able to teach those who find it difficult. The reward is even bigger when a pupil who really struggled goes on to pass their test!

In case you don't already know, Corsley and Chapmanslade are situated close to the centre of the block of four Petroleum **Exploration and Development Licences** (PEDL), which have been issued in Wiltshire. These can eventually lead to the drilling and/or fracking of our local countryside for coal-bed methane, shale gas or underground coal gasification.

It is sobering to learn that the NFU have recently added exclusion 19 to their farming insurance. Their policy document states they "will not pay for liability arising out of any

activity involving prospecting or extraction of liquid or gaseous fuels. An example of such an activity is fracking".

With 60% of the UK available to fracking companies and around 10 million acres already licensed, the single most significant factor in what happens next in any area, is our community response.

Counselling is one option but there are plenty of others and surely the most exciting learning you can do is finding out more about you, how ever you go about it.
