




Temporary introduction of 30mph speed limit A362 Corsley Heath, Corsley

Wiltshire Council has made an order to temporarily introduce a 30mph speed restriction on the A362 Corsley Heath, Corsley; from a point approximately 30 metres east of its junction with Baytree Close for approximately 500m in a westerly direction.

To enable Wiltshire Council to carry out footway/pedestrian crossing works. The speed restriction will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

This speed limit restriction will come into operation on **6th July** and will be required until 24th July. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete depending upon weather conditions. This Notice will have a maximum duration of 21 days.



Science: changing the world

How is science reported?

During the last few weeks there has been a number of reports on scientific research about COVID-19. Some of the science has been reported very quickly because of the pandemic emergency and has not gone through the traditional processes of scientific review and publication

So, what are the scientific process and the normal way of making the results of discovery known? The process starts with an idea – a hypothesis – about how something may happen. This idea is then tested by experiment, using appropriate controls. For example, in studying the effects of an infection on people, a control would be people who are not infected. Both groups should contain sufficient numbers, matched by age, sex and other characteristics, that individual variation is cancelled out. The requirement for large numbers is why animal models of the infection are often used.

If the hypothesis is apparently correct, it can be further tested by changing different parameters (e.g. What is the minimum dose for infection? Does changing the method of delivery change the infection?). However, if the results are important and exciting the results of just the initial experiments may be written up in a scientific paper.

A paper is submitted to a journal for publication. At this stage the paper should be read and criticised by other scientists who are experts in the field. This process, known as peer review, is essential in weeding out science that has been done badly or for which other conclusions can be drawn. Peer review may require that further experiments are done, or the paper is revised, or the paper may be rejected for publication.

There have been two significant changes to this process, which have implications to the reporting of scientific conclusions. The first is the proliferation of sub-standard scientific journals, in which authors pay to publish and the peer review process is inadequate. I receive several invitations each month to publish in such. A lot of bad science can appear through these sources. Therefore it is important to know that the science has been published in a trustworthy journal.

The second is the appearance of so-called 'pre-print servers'. These are internet resources to which scientists can upload a new paper to be read by other scientists without waiting for the long process of peer review. A mix of excellent and poor science appears this way, and the reader is expected to judge the quality. Unfortunately, several of these servers can be accessed by anyone, so results may be taken and appear as newspaper headlines, even if the science is poor and the conclusions are wrong.


Several of the important papers on COVID-19 have been about modelling the transmission of infection. Here the process is slightly different from experimental science in that a model is created (the hypothesis) and the parameters of the model are changed (the experiment) until the revised model best matches real observations. Publication then occurs as before. Whether it is experimental

science or modelling, the comments of experts other than a report's authors should be taken into account in judging the conclusions.

Much has been made by politicians of "following the science" in the response to COVID-19. However, scientific conclusions can change because of better science being done and more information being available. In mid-February, when I wrote my article for the March edition of The Bridge, I thought that flu was a more significant problem than COVID-19. I did say "However, this may change" and indeed it did!



Corsley Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the PC's activity in June

There have been no 'remote' PC meetings in the past month but one or two routine administrative matters have been dealt with online and there was one planning application. The PC has also received notice of an application from the White Hart pub to the Wiltshire Council Licencing Authority for an extension to the current licence. More details of this are given below.

New planning applications 20/02977/FUL & 20/03601/LBC

Replacement of existing swing barriers at Knapp's Gate and The Stalls entrance with automatic lifting barriers to match barrier installed at Longcombe -Longleat House Estate Office

These applications both refer to the same proposal and contain essentially the same proposal documents. However, the Listed Building application (LBC) was withdrawn and the full proposal now contains an amendment to the intended design of barrier to be installed, plus comments from five residents living in the immediate vicinity of Knapp's Gate regarding the gate at that location. The proposal is to replace the existing steel swing gates by a metal boom type pole gate, a "pop up road blocker", traffic lights and intercom, at the same location as the existing swing gates.

Comments by the residents local to Knapps Gate centred on the impact of waiting traffic close to residential properties in terms of noise, pollution from waiting cars, glare from the traffic lights, plus the

blockage and congestion introduced by queues and turning vehicles. Their preferred and requested solution was to move the new gates southwards to the position of the cattle grid, which had previously been located to alleviate most of these same issues.

The PC published the application on The Bridge website and the two village noticeboards and local residents received notification. No comments were received and the PC agreed no objection.

A362 road safety improvements at the Heath

The details of this project were included in recent briefs and we have now received notice that the current plan is for the work to start on 7th July, with an expected duration of two weeks. There will be a temporary 30mph speed limit during the works and single lane traffic working controlled by three-way temporary lights around the 'triangle' area. Simon Jasper has briefed those most affected by the work, notably numbers 106 and 107.

White Hart licence extension application

The full details of the extension application can be viewed on the Wiltshire Council licencing page www.wiltshire.gov.uk/ licences-permits-new-premises-applications and representations can be made to publicprotectionnorth@wiltshire.gov.uk by the deadline of 10th July.

Alternatively, the PC is content to receive any views to myself, email as below, or John Willcox (PC Clerk) corsleypc jdw@aol.co.uk (please note the underscore) by **7th July**.

In considering its response, the PC will be consulting widely, including the residents of Lane End, Longleat and the other two pubs in the village.

Please note, however, that there is a protocol relating to representations, particularly the need to address only the application extension (not the current licence) and to make comments which relate to at least one of the following four areas:

- Prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- Prevention of public nuisance
- Protection of children from harm.

I have produced a brief which summarises the changes, the current licence and the representations process and I have asked the Editor to put them on the Bridge website. It will also be posted on the village noticeboards.

At this time of year, we normally invite people to take out/renew their membership of the Corsley Show Society. As you know, the decision was made to cancel the show in 2020 due to all the uncertainty of COVID-19 and the lockdown

The main committee members are automatically members of the Society, but to ensure wider representation from the village is able to vote at any meetings that may be held it has been decided that those whose membership would have officially ended on 30th June 2020 will automatically be extended until 30th June 2021.

We will not be issuing new membership cards, should we need to verify membership for any reason we have a list of names.

As a result of the early decision to cancel the show we have avoided any significant costs this year. Some traders have transferred their deposits to the 2021 show and, any deposits we had paid have also been transferred to the 2021 show: so the Corsley Show remains in good financial shape.

Application to vary a premises licence for the White Hart pub, Lane End

Corsley PC has received notification of an application by Adelle Gill to vary the conditions of the licence at the White Hart pub, Lane End. The variation includes the following:

Live music, indoors

- Seven days per week 5pm to midnight
- Bank holidays 1pm to midnght
- New Year's Eve all night from the permitted hours, i.e. midnight, until the permitted start time on New Year's day, i.e. 5pm.

Recorded music, indoors

- Seven days per week 8.30am to midnight
- New Year's Eve all night from the permitted hours, i.e. midnight, until the permitted start time on New Year's Day, i.e. 8.30am.

Performance of dance (location unspecified)

• New year's Eve, 5pm to midnight.

Take away service, indoors and outdoors

• Seven days a week – 11pn to midnight.

Extension of hours for the supply of alcohol

- Seven days a week 10pm to midnight
- New Year's Eve from end of permitted hours until start of same on New Year's Day.

Opening hours New Year's Eve

8.30am until 8.30am on New Year's Day.

A sketch plan of the pub and its outdoor arrangements has been provided, showing the seating areas, car parking and indicating a potential area for music, though this contradicts the application form which indicates only indoor music. No indication is provided of outdoor takeaway facilities.

Existing Licence

The existing licence is very straightforward:

Supply of alcohol on the premises

12 noon – 11pm, seven days per week.

Opening hours

8.30am – 11pm seven days per week However, it should be noted that no licence permission is required for the performance of unamplified live music between 8am and 11pm on any day, on any premises.

Performance of amplified live music between 8am and 11pm on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on the premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

Any playing of recorded music between 8am and 11pm on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on the premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

Representations

Representations may be provided, in writing, clearly stating the reasons for objection which must relate to at least one of the four licensing objectives:

- Prevention of crime and disorder
- · Public safety
- Prevention of public nuisance
- · Protection of children from harm


The name and address of the person making the representation must be included and the comments may only refer to the variation and **not** the existing licence.

The Parish Council will be giving consideration to making its own representation and, if necessary, holding an online meeting to agree the content. Any

member of the village on the electoral roll over the age of 18 is invited to offer written comments to the Parish Council, to the Parish Clerk, via email corsleypc jdw@aol.co.uk, by 30th June. Alternatively, individual comments may be sent directly to the Licensing Authority at Wiltshire Council to arrive by 10th July.

This note has been delivered to all residents of Lane End within a 400 metre radius of the White Hart and to the Editor of The Bridge for posting on the Bridge website, and will be posted on the village noticeboards.

Countryside Matters

Be still, sad heart! and cease repining; Behind the clouds is the sun still shining; Thy fate is the common fate of all, Into each life some rain must fall...

I'm sitting here writing my article on 24th of June when we're all enjoying (or not) temperatures in the high 20s, it's only a week ago that the skies were full of thunder and storm clouds and keeping warm at home meant turning the central heating back on!

This month we have recorded 4" of rain following three months of such an insignificant amount of rain it was barely measurable.

By mid June, most farmers were looking at bare pastures; the crops of grass for the second cut of silage or hay had gone to seed, which results in very little food value and extremely light crops. Sadly, this resulted in the stores of silage meant for next winter having to be opened up to feed hungry cattle. Then, like magic, the rain came in such a good amount that the countryside turned green in a matter of days – happy farmers and gardeners again!

The maize crop has benefitted from both the heat and the rain and was knee-high by the 5th of June, a month earlier than usual let's hope it will now keep growing!

Since lockdown, most of us have been required to stay at home. How fortunate we are to live in these lovely villages where we can at least enjoy our own gardens. Those who are able to go further afield have enjoyed the countryside at its very best.

With some restrictions to our activities

being slowly lifted, we have seen greater traffic movement and noise and, of course, those in employment and who are needed, are now able to help to get the country back up and running.

A big problem for sheep farmers this year has been the shortage of people who can shear the sheep. This now means waiting in turn for a team of shearers to visit the farms as it involves men working in close proximity to each other shearing, rolling the wool and packing it. Shepherds and farmer have to be assured that all vehicles and equipment involved have been disinfected after each farm visit. Although the cost of shearing sheep far outweighs the value of the wool, we still have to go through the process as the animals' health is so important.

May I request those who are able, and especially dog-walkers, to use footpaths away from farm buildings and the families living on the farm.

The dreaded scourge of fly tipping of garden, household and building waste is once again causing problems in gateways and on footpaths. Please report all incidents and, if possible, vehicle number plates of the perpetrators, especially where the rubbish could be dangerous to people or animals, to Wiltshire Council.

Keep safe and well.

The pub is The White Hart Corsley, the pub has reopened following around 7 years of mostly closure and returned to it's original name. The White Hart!!

The pub features two restaurant areas at each end of the open plan interior with a proper drinking bar space in between. The large bar is covered with natural stone to match the floor, and around one side of the double-sided wood burning stove log fire are comfortable large red leather chesterfields and chairs. A darts board and a life size suit of armour add to the relaxed and slightly quirky atmosphere of this country pub.

The bar sports a trendy copper 'T' bar which lightens the dark stone tile bar top complete with funky wine label themed wall paper and real stone floors it gives a genuinely good warm vibe. The pub has a small beer garden and large cars parks.

We originally came down to Wiltshire from Yorkshire to run a pub a stone's throw away from The White Hart and situated in the same village. But, as luck would have it, that didn't work out and so our journey began. We had given up everything to move over 300 miles to Wiltshire to run the pub and when

things all fell apart we were left with nothing and nowhere to go. Randomly we were offered a caravan by John Patch of Whitehole spring water, who at the time was a complete stranger, and with whom we stayed for seven months saving us from being completely homeless.

Spring came and we found the woods surrounding our caravan was full of wild garlic which John suggested to us that if we were to pick the garlic we could sell it to chefs in London. It was a crazy idea but we had nothing to lose and everything to gain and so our adventure started. Thanks to John's generosity and our hard work picking the garlic during the day and driving up to Covent Garden to sell it at night our fortunes started to change. It brought us to Raymond Blanc's kitchen meeting with Gary Jones and selling the wild garlic direct to Le Manoir aux Quat' Saisons. We had a short video made about us and we launched the spring burger with Honest Burgers in Bristol. Our enthusiasm sparked interest and a family member offered to help us lease another pub. We spent some time looking around at available pubs in the area but in our hearts we knew which was the

pub we wanted - The White Hart!

The pub was in the same village as our old pub where the locals enjoyed our food and crazy northern ways and we had already built up a customer base. Situated on the junction of a busy main road and the lane leading to the Longleat Caravan Club site the tourists were close.

So we have Adelle the licencee and the Yorkshire chef Stephen. We just needed one more person who came in the form of Clare Bayman. Clare had worked with us previously at the other pub where she was our mediator - our calming influence - our rock. Clare was delighted to come back and help us, we trained her up on the bar instead of working in the kitchen as she had previously as we all agreed the local girl needed to be out front. To replace Clare in the kitchen we then found Jack and Josh. These two young lads work hard and are hugely keen to learn as much as possible from chef Stephen whilst keeping the kitchen clean and tidy. They may fight like an old married couple but both have a fantastic work ethic and are shaping up for a future in the hospitality industry. Then came Kieran a young and handsome chap - a perfect addition to our bar.

The drinks - we are known for been somewhat 'outside the box' with our food menu so we decided to try to dot he same with our drinks. Our best seller is Red Stripe all our lagers which are all served in frozen glasses for that perfect pint. We also decided to stick something that would be seen as up and coming on so added American Pale Ale Maltsmiths along with Old Mout berries and cherry's cider which have all proved to be popular. All on tap and all for under £,4 per pint our idea was 'let's make a statement for free house prices'. We also have our signature shot Agwa which we buy direct from Amsterdam.

Our food concept is unique & bespoke out with ham 'n' eggs and in with Yorkshire puddings. We have created innovative Yorkshire pudding dishes. We don't freeze food and we make our own Authentic curry, all spices bought directly from Asian super markets in Bristol. And of cause Yorkshire puddings. Our signature dish is the Yorkshire slider three Yorkshire puddings on one plate with three ever changing fillings. The Yorkshire burrito all the best bits of Sunday dinner wrapped in a yorkie pud. The menu changes daily with some controversial products like spam fritters and some of the most blazay burgers you have ever seen. The menu is garnteeted to raise a few eyebrows but generally excite people and give this sleepy village an edge.

The pub regularly donates food to the homeless we made 150 Christmas dinners to feed people less fortunate on Xmas eve. We also regularly have these nights we change the whole pub into an Indian restaurant once a month and dress in fancy dress. We always go that extra mile.

The future who knows what the future holds for the white hart we do plan to grow and reinvent our selfs regularly to keep the magic

Parish Council Briefing

Notes from the Parish Council meeting held on 28th May and 11th June

Notes from the meeting on 28th May

This meeting was held using Microsoft Teams, as the use of such media allows the activities of the PC to continue during the current COVID-19 situation. The public are able to join the meeting and take part and observe in the usual manner.

Tim Humphreys, on behalf of the village hall committee, addressed the meeting to explain their accounts and their plans for 2020 and beyond. Clearly there is an impact on the village hall finances due to not being able to let the village hall during the COVID-19 situation. The village hall committee was exploring the availability of grants from Wiltshire Council and the Community Fund.

The meeting went into closed session and approved the minutes of the last PC meeting. The PC then discussed the following issues:

PC accounts

There was discussion to approve the PC accounts and these were approved with final internal audit due before our next meeting on June 11th.

Planning applications

There were two planning applications to be discussed but it was agreed that these would be discussed at the meeting on June 11th. It was noted that the planning application for Thoulstone Farm was one of many in the last few weeks and it was agreed that the Chairman would discuss the Thoulstone Farm development with our local Councillor Fleur

De Rhe Philipe. It was reported that three planning applications had been approved by Wiltshire Council, all with conditions.

It was agreed that holding the meeting using Microsoft Teams was satisfactory but only for the period of the COVID-19 restrictions. It was recorded that Francis Morland has asked for leave of absence during the period of COVID-19 restrictions as he does not possess the necessary facilities to take part in a Microsoft Teams meeting. In correspondence there were three items.

The next meeting of the PC is scheduled for 11th June and will again be a virtual meeting using Teams.

Notes from the meeting on 11th June

Keith Muston resumed the role of Chairman for part of the meeting and thanked John Lewis for being the acting Chairman during his recent period of health issues.

The Chairman commented on the requirement to hold virtual meetings and recognised the difficulty this presented for some members of the PC.

A member of the public questioned the PC on their thoughts regarding the future of the Three Horseshoes, drawing the council's attention to comments on social media. Members responded that the council would support local businesses as long as the COVID-19 guidance on reopening the business was followed. It was commented that we, as a village, fully support our village pub

and the period when the Three Horseshoes was previously closed was a dark period.

The Chairman thanked Tim Humphreys for his work as our Internal Auditor.

The meeting went into the closed session and approved the minutes of the last PC meeting. The PC then discussed the following

Planning applications

It was agreed to move this item forward to enable Councillor Fleur De Rhe Philipe to participate and subsequently retire from the meeting.

20/04352/PNCOU

Application to change the use of an agricultural barn to four residential dwellings.

Councillor Philipe advised the meeting that this was a pre-application prior to a permitted development proposal. In summary the PC is most concerned at the scale of development on this historic site. It was agreed that the PC would write to Wiltshire Council putting forward their concerns not only about the current applications but our concerns that the scale of the proposed developments is not suitable for a Grade 2 listed farmhouse, which, if the applications are approved, would be surrounded by at least thirteen residential properties. We also noted that on the latest plans there is shown an access hole in the boundary wall of the listed walled garden. We also agreed to write to Wiltshire Council Enforcement as we believe this new access hole in a listed wall requires Listed Building Consent which has not been applied for.

20/03866/FUL

Application for an extension to 4 Pedlars Grove.

The PC recognised that this was a very large extension but, following discussion, decided that no objection would be raised.

We had received a request from Lochailort in connection with the development at Barters

Farm. They wish to be a part of our next meeting to advise us of the next stages of this development and it has since been agreed that they will join the July meeting. The councillors are most concerned that we must endeavour to offer a platform where the village can partake in this discussion. If we can hold an open meeting, with social distancing, we will endeavour to do so but we must follow the COVID-19 guidelines applicable on the day.

The internal audit and all associated forms for the external process were approved.

It was noted that all Community Area Traffic Group meetings have been suspended until further notice.

There was a discussion on the widths of footpaths and social distancing, but the conclusion was that we must rely on common sense as having restrictions on an A class road were unlikely to be realistic.

The next PC meeting will be a virtual meeting on **Thursday 9th July** at **7pm**.
