

### **Corsley War Memorial Playing Field**

# History from 1947 to 1954

Read about the Reverend Alban Ernest Elliott, vicar of St Margaret's Church, who instigated the playing field, and the trials and tribulations that followed...

In July 1947 the Reverend attended the major sale of Longleat land and property. His bid of f,1000 was successful and he became the owner of the three fields known locally as Holmes or Red Street. Plots 577 and 575 became the Memorial Field as we know it today.

On 11th September 1947, a public meeting was held in the Reading Rooms at which the Reverend explained his purchase to a crowded hall - the first Corsley Memorial Field Committee was then elected. Money was raised by public subscription and donations from the village until 30th December 1950 -the field was sold into Trust for £,530, and in 1951 the Corsley War Memorial Field was registered as a charity.

"It is a Charitable Trust to provide for the maintenance and improvement of the physical wellbeing of persons resident in the parish of Corsley in the county of Wiltshire by the provisions of facilities for Physical Training and Recreation."

In 1953 the Trust found itself in debt, so the committee members agreed that each of them should donate f,5 to wipe out the bank overdraft. The members were Mr Thomas, P Carr, H. Jones, L. Young, R. Snelgrove, R. Joynt, N Francis, L White and Mrs (Nurse) Hobbs 7s 3d.

With the debt cleared, so began a fundraising campaign that continues today to meet the maintenance costs and the capital

outlay needed for improved facilities. One of the early fundraising events was a dance held in the Reading Rooms at 3/- (15p) admission that raised f.6. It was looked upon as a great success! Other events included a skittles week at the Royal Oak which raised £,48 and a bring-and-buy sale at the Corsley Show.

The funds were used to build brick pillars at the entrance of the field and Len White (at the Wagon Works) was asked to produce a set of swings for the children to play on. And so the play area was established.

In 1954 the committee decided to have an opening ceremony for the Field on the 14th November, Remembrance Day. Len White was asked to repair a pair of wrought iron gates and the two bronze plaques that can still be seen today on the pillars were ordered from the Somerset Smithy. One plaque records the First World War fatalities and the other, the Second World War deaths including the civilians killed on Corsley Heath in April 1941.

The official opening ceremony was on the 14th November when the memorial plaques were unveiled by Lieutenant Colonel A E Newland to a fanfare by the 1st Wiltshire Regiment of Buglers. The Reverend Gerald Trotman conducted a memorial service of prayers and hymns accompanied by the Frome Town Band for the "goodly congregation of 70 or more people."

# **Parish Council Briefing**

Heavy Goods Vehicle weight limit progress report, September 2024

### Attendees

On Friday 20th September, members of the three-village Heavy Goods Vehicle (HGV) action group met representatives of Wiltshire Council to discuss progress toward implementing weight limits in Maiden Bradley, Corsley and Chapmanslade.

The meeting was attended by Cllr Tamara Reay, Cabinet Member for Transport and Assets, Cllr Bill Parks, who represents our three villages, and officers from Wiltshire Council - Dave Thomas, Head of Highways Asset Management & Commissioning, and Martin Aldham, Senior Transport Planner.

### The meeting

In the meeting, Wiltshire Council officers presented the preliminary results of data modelling of lorry displacement should the weight limits be implemented. We also discussed options for implementing the weight limits in each village singly or together, and it was agreed that this should be included in the model. We also talked about plans for potential safety improvements to the A303/350, and stakeholder engagement with the Mendip quarry producers.

It was agreed that the next meeting will be held in November, at which time we will discuss updated data modelling results and review options for implementing the weight limits.

The villages also submitted two campaign letters to Cllr Tamara Reay, the cabinet

member, underlining the impact of HGV traffic on residents along the B3092. This included a petition from residents of Norton Ferris and Kilmington, and letters from parents in Maiden Bradley.

Cllr Bill Parks, who represents the three villages asked Wiltshire Council to 'step-up' action to enforce the use of the designated freight routes through the area. He noted that the lorries are affecting hundreds of lives daily, tearing the heart out of rural communities.

### Our view

The representatives of the three villages campaign group expressed our appreciation to Wiltshire Council, and to our councillor Bill Parks, for their ongoing efforts to find a solution to HGV traffic. We look forward to hearing about progress made in our next meeting.

We did however raise the following concerns:

- · Questions were raised about the baseline data and assumptions in the model, including the specific context relevant to each of the three villages.
- · Chapmanslade noted that displacement is irrelevant to them, given their problem is a small number of HGVs that cause huge disruption
- · Corsley noted that any HGV using their village as a short cut will already be using the strategic route to enter and exit the village and so any displacement will be onto

roads these lorries are already using

· Maiden Bradley noted that HGVs using the village as a short-cut will be displaced onto designated strategic freight routes in Wiltshire and Somerset, which is where they are meant to be traveling.

Overall, our campaign group believes that Wiltshire Council is placing too much weight on data modelling of future risk than the reality of actual impacts on the ground. For hundreds of people, this reality means large HGVs routinely driving through villages, at all hours of the day and night, causing disruption and gridlock on narrow roads never designed for this sort of traffic. We question why our rural communities should bear this burden alone, and encourage Wiltshire Council to take all steps necessary to facilitate HGV use of designated strategic freight routes.



### **End pieces**

Updates were heard from Councillors on:

- · The good work being done by the 'Secret Stile' team to replace stiles with kissing gates. A further 7 new gates were agreed, and these will be 75% funded by the Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group.
- The agreement with Wiltshire Council Highways engineers to review the A 3098 speed limits and signage from Barters Nursery to Tower Hill in conjunction with both the Warminster and Westbury Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Groups and with the support of the two unitary councillors.
- The work undertaken by the Parish Steward and any other work for his 24 October visit.
- The Council agreed to pay a donation

of £130 to the Royal British Legion for a wreath for this year's Remembrance Sunday. This year's service will be on 10 November and will include the dedication of a new plaque on the war memorial with the names of two sons of Chapmanslade who gave their lives in the Service of their Country during WWII. Considerable thanks need to go to the Church Warden, Ian Buick, and the History Group, especially Terry Rose, for putting in the considerable work required to make this happen.

# Six Open Doors

Dear Friends.

For the past year the letter on this page had been written by Rev Caroline Husband, who was our Rural Dean until the beginning of October. Her support had been quite amazing and, even in a short time, she was able to provide us with support and introduce fresh ways to reach you all in our community. We wished her every success and happiness in her new life and work in Cornwall. We are currently without anyone in her vacated role, so find ourselves being even more self reliant than ever.

November is a month of reflection which begins with moments of remembrance and, later, sees us preparing for the Church New Year. All Saints and All Souls days at the start of the month give us moments to pause and firstly remember all those saints who have helped to influence our lives in every respect. There are the many saints who are commemorated in our churches and have their own saints day, but this is an occasion to reflect on all who have enriched our lives in so many ways. They don't have a special label or day but have committed their lives to the service of us all. They are also living amongst us, right now in our villages, often ignored and unappreciated. God knows and cares for them, so please give a moment to remember them. All Souls is a much more personal moment, when we recall all whom we have known and loved, but are no longer with us. Remembrance Sunday this year will, as always, be an opportunity to reflect on all who have lost their lives in war. The dedication of a new plague commemorating the two Chapmanslade residents lost in WW2 on the war memorial will be a very special occasion.

Later in November we begin to prepare for our new Church year at Advent on 1st December. This is a time for us to think about what we have achieved in God's service during the past 12 months. With the appearance of Christmas decorations and many reminders of numbers of shopping days to go, we are tempted to try to avoid considering those who are suffering around a world, currently facing so many challenges of war, persecution and starvation.

We also face real challenges in continuing to meet everyone's needs here in Corsley and Chapmanslade. The most urgent of these, is how do we maintain our parish with a shrinking pool of active volunteers. It is fair to say, we are one step away from having to think hard about what we can sustain and what to curtail. We are getting real support with fresh initiatives from the Diocese, especially since the arrival of Bishop Steven the current Bishop of Salisbury. Principal among these is agreement with our Archdeacon, to recruit a new Rector, who will be a specialist in what we call Mission. Put simply, this is someone who will be highly skilled in reaching out to everyone in our community, no matter whether they are churchgoers or not. If the plans succeed, 1/3 of their time will be spent doing this mission work here and the other rural parishes in our Deanery, which are the villages grouped around Warminster and Westbury.

We live in hope and God's love.

# Finally, a new plaque!

Commemorating two lives lost

In the April edition of The Bridge I published an article letting everyone know of an initiative to add a new plaque with the names of the two servicemen from Chapmanslade who lost their lives in WW2, 80 years ago this year, to the War Memorial, which sits in

the grounds of St Philip and St James' Church. Currently, the memorial, which was dedicated on 12th September 1920, only displays the names of the servicemen who died in WW I. The names of the two servicemen who lost their lives in WW2 are:

- Wyndham Carter, Wiltshire Regiment Infantry, son of Frank and Francis, husband of Phyllis, killed in action in Lazio, Italy, aged 28.
- Kenneth Chalk, Royal Air Force 77th Squadron, son of William and Hilda, a rear gunner on a Halifax bomber. He lost his life at the age of 21 along with six other crew, three of whom were Canadian, during an air attack on Berlin.

It has been a complex process to obtain a faculty from the Church of England to proceed with the work; the equivalent to obtaining full planning permission to make changes to a Grade 2 listed building - and then some. With the full support of the

Corsley & Chapmanslade Parochial Church Council and Chapmanslade Parish Council, the faculty was officially received by Ian Buick, our Church Warden, at the end of September, so it has taken seven months to get this far.

> Now the work starts for an approved stonemason to carry out essential maintenance work on the War Memorial before fixing the new bronze plaque, as depicted in the image, in time for it to be dedicated during a special Act of Remembrance on Sunday 10th November, assembling at the church from 10.45am for a 10.55 start.

Following the Act of Remembrance,

Chapmanslade Church will be open to host the community when there will be a presentation about the two men and their families, the complex process needed to approve the plaque and the history of the the war memorial (the Cross). Refreshments will be available.

We look forward to welcoming representatives from Warminster Royal British Legion to join with us in our commemoration this year.

# **Wonderful Walks**

# A lovely surprise!

I haven't been to Lacock for many years, so when second granddaughter Katie and partner, Fraser, asked if I'd like to go with them, it was a lovely surprise! Fraser parked up in the National Trust car park on the village outskirts and, fee paid, we headed away. Across the zebra crossing, there's a




pavement on Hither Way that takes you right first, but at the next junction, go left on High Street. There are facilities and a café to the left, but we crossed the High Street, walking right, alongside the Abbey grounds' outer wall and passing a crab apple tree decorated with red and rotting little fruits.

Fraser took their dog Charlie walking and swimming, while Katie and I entered the National Trust reception and paid to explore the Abbey grounds. Some photos this time are Katie's handiwork; her photography skills are excellent. Leaving reception, find the wide path, with railings on one side and the abbey beyond that. The path leads into a small wood, with old greenhouses away to the right. That's where we went, walking round a Victorian walled garden with lovely flower beds and a banana tree, with small fruit and a flower on. After circling that garden, return to the wider path and branch off left. Along

here, there's a tall pillared monument with something like a sculpted female sphinx on top, but after viewing it, return again to the wide track, not far from the Abbey entrance. There's a 'Gothic' archway on the right, into the Abbey grounds themselves, but looking left, you'll see the roof of the courtyard stables, with its clock and bell tower. I always understood that a 'lad' had to sleep above the stables in old times; it was his job to ring the bell should there be a disaster, such as fire, theft or an escaping horse.

Go back towards the woodland and you'll pass a huge rotting tree stump on your right, with three saplings growing from it. Further on, there's a pond and before we reached it, I thought the 'grasses' I could see were reeds, though no water was visible. Once we stood at the pond edge, I saw water! To the right, there's a low and sunken wall and I told Katie it looked like a 'haha'; she hadn't heard of



that before, but that's what it was! It's really an optical illusion that meant people in the house could see animals close by, but the animals couldn't get to the house and lawns and make a mess of them! Back

on the path and away from the wooded area, you'll see Lacock Abbey itself, founded in 1232 by the Countess of Salisbury. Some early buildings remain, such as the cloisters and the chapter house. Here, Katie and I used a side track, back through the trees again, looked over a 'normal' wall and saw Lacock village ahead of us. Moving again, we found running water nearby, a stream maybe, with a weir and a false rock wall, built to 'enhance' the view.

After that, in open country again, you'll see fields ahead, beyond metal railings. Find the gate through the fence and you're in the fields, with mowed footpaths crossing and circling them. Katie and I explored a bit and could have crossed several fields - but it was

nearly lunchtime; please extend our walk for us, if you can! Afterwards, look for the main track again, somewhere near a truncated tree with fungus on its trunk, and a huge wattle 'decoration' at its top. As we walked round the tree, we found metal railings and removed ourselves from the field, getting back on the wide track yet again. Here's where I found something really exciting - a beautifully slim and slimy, tan-coloured slug, though Katie wasn't sure why such a find thrilled me!

From there, walk along the front of the Abbey building and turn right at the octagonal corner tower, built after the Reformation, when Sir William Sharington

> turned the Abbey into a country mansion. Round that corner you'll find a later, possibly Georgian, stepped entrance into a newer building. Through the 'Gothic' archway ahead, Katie and I

saw the stable clock and bell tower again, and turned right into the stable courtyard, to use facilities. Leaving the Abbey grounds, we found Fraser and Charlie, and had a hot lunch at the Red Lion pub at the junction of High Street and East Street: mv macaroni cheese was yummy!

'The Son of Man did not come to be served...' Mark 10:45

#### Why Four Gospels?

The central theme of the Bible, Old Testament and New, is the Lord Jesus Christ, He is the Focal Point, The New Testament Gospels focus on the Saviour's life and teaching; the word 'gospel' means 'Good News'. These written accounts tell the wonderful message of forgiveness, reconciliation and new life, through the Lord Iesus.

The four reporters who wrote the Good News are Matthew, a converted tax collector, Mark a missionary, Luke a physician and John a fisherman; each

provides a snapshot of the Saviour's life. Why four gospels? Because one wasn't enough to give a balanced portrait of the Lord Jesus.

Let us examine this wonderful Saviour through the eyes of the Gospel writers. Matthew wrote primarily for the Jews; he saw the Lord Jesus as a Mighty king, and sought to convince Jewish readers the Lord Jesus is the Messiah. At least nine times he shows that Jesus is the fulfilment of Old Testament Prophecies - Christ came to establish His Kingdom.

Mark viewed the Lord Jesus as a Suffering servant, one engaged in serving His fellow man. It is a 'Gospel of Action' - Jesus' actions as a servant, as in Mark 10:45: "for the son of

Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and give his life as a ransom for many."

Luke wrote of Christ as the ideal man and emphasises Jesus' humanity, giving us more detail about the birth than any other writer; he is only one who tells of Jesus' childhood. Luke presents the human-interest stories and parables Christ shared, lingering longer on the death of Christ...

John presents the Lord Jesus as the Divine Son of God, not only a king, or merely a servant, or simply a man. He was the Lord

God - Deity. He never stopped being God, even while on this earth. John presents the Lord Jesus

> performing one miracle after another, ones that only the Divine Son of God could perform. There is a progression, called 'signs', seven in all, from Changing Water into Wine to Raising the Dead, showing Christ as the only Son of God and

How does this apply to us today? We are called to be Servants of the Lord Iesus. Whatever role we are facing right now, God's desire is that we live out each day for his Glory, to be his Servants and Disciples, so that by seeing each one of us, others may believe that the Lord Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God

## What are they charging you?

Do you live at the Heathway, Corsley? Then read on...

There is no mains drainage in Corsley so most of the houses have their own drainage systems. However, many of the homes along Heathway and the flats behind were built by the council in the 1930-50s. These homes are on three different shared-drainage systems. Over the years, some of them were bought by their owners and others are now managed by Selwood Housing.

The deeds for all the homes specify that Selwood Housing can charge you for the waste management provision or replacement of the system if necessary. Specifically, to quote Selwood Housing "Under clause 12.6.2 of the transfer you are obliged to contribute a fair proportion of the cost to Selwood on demand of the operating costs of emptying, cleansing and replacing septic tanks and/or sewage disposal works. There is no obligation on Selwood to itemise the bill."

Around 12 months ago the soakaway for numbers 1 to 6 Heathway was reported as broken and subsequently claimed to be repaired by Selwood Housing contractors. Since then their engineer has assessed the system every month and written to Selwood Housing to say the system is still broken. To support his assessment, waste collection has gone from a normal six months to every four to five weeks.

Despite the service getting worse, our bills have gone up!

Speaking to home owners along Heathway, we have found out that each of us are charged different amounts with the figure ranging between £500-£800 per annum.

With the help of Parish Councillor Dr Neil Carpenter, County Councillor Bill Parks and Dr Murrison MP, we have been trying

to get to the bottom of the charges from Selwood Housing for waste management and why they vary so much for identical homes. Dr Murrison has written multiple times to Selwood Housing who have refused to provide adequate explanations to all his questions. It is not a surprise to find out that less than 50% of Selwood Housing's customers are satisfied with their approach to handling complaints.

This ability to charge home owners whatever cost Selwood Housing feel is acceptable is at the heart of the issue and, despite all the work by those involved, Selwood Housing has failed to provide an adequate explanation for their charging policy.

Selwood Housing have claimed that the charges are based on the rateable value of the properties. Council Tax was introduced in 1993 - before Selwood Housing took over the properties – however, whatever system they are using, all the houses are the same, so they should all have the same charges.

Finally, they do not offer single person, pensioner or benefits claimants discounts, so this pricing is not a reflection of lower occupancy, lower amounts of waste or the ability to afford the charges. Wessex Water, who provide the potable water into the homes, does provide these discount.

In conclusion, we would like to collect more data to force Selwood Housing to provide fair charging for all residents. Could you please let us know how much you are paying? Your information will be kept in confidence and no names will be shared.

## **Countryside Matters**

Autumn in the countryside is possibly the most spectacular Month and October has excelled itself

Wonderful sunsets, the harvest moon and most of the British Isles experiencing the northern lights, early morning mists, followed by lovely warm days. The colours of the leaves in our woodlands and hedgerows could be compared with those in New England, USA.

But what so many will remember of October 2024 is the heavy rain storms, with flooding reaching areas not normally seen or experienced for many years.

The late harvesting of maize and potatoes has been hampered by soil compaction and soil movement from field to roads on the tyres of heavy tractors and harvesting equipment.

The erosion of soil from freshly-worked arable and reseeded fields and the impact of extremely heavy rain storms has caused blocked drains, ditches and excess water on normal flood plains.

By early October, the cattle had to be housed above flood level at least a month earlier than normal. Extending the winter feeding programme an extra month will be costly, creating a drain on already smaller stores of home-produced feed stuffs.

During the autumn, breeding sheep are often moved from mountainous areas such as Scotland and the northern counties to the south and south west of England to graze on dryer dairy farms until spring when they will be transported back north for the lambing season.

Other lambs not suitable for breeding will be sold at market in the east such as the Kent Marches and sold to farmers who will feed them on grass here in the south/and south west. This helps to graze the grass shorter than cattle would, their weight will help to level the ground and bring a welcome increase in income to the dairy farmer when they go to market in the early spring.

Hallowe'en has become more popular in recent years, with pumpkins and gourds being grown for pick-your-own or sold in great numbers in our supermarkets; great fun for children and another cash crop which, if marketed well, can be another source of income to farmers.

Early November sees Guy Fawks and the Gunpowder Plot being celebrated with large communal fireworks parties and bonfires. Can I just remind those intending to host a party to please check for hedgehogs that may be nesting in the pile of wood waiting to be burned and please let neighbours who own cats, dogs or horses that you intend letting off fireworks so that they can take precautions with their pets.

As winter looms enjoy the highlights and prepare for cosy evenings by the fire.
