





Biology: changing the world

What's the fuss about gasification?

As a nation we produce too much waste. What can we do about it?


One solution is not to generate waste, and the recent publicity about avoiding the use of plastics is an example of this. If we cannot prevent waste being generated, then recycling is the next best option. However, some waste products cannot easily be recycled for reuse. The traditional way of dealing with such waste was to put it into landfill or to incinerate it.

Waste in landfill generates nothing useful and may, as it decomposes, produce large amounts of methane, a potent greenhouse gas contributing to global warming. Incineration, however, can produce something useful – heat. Incineration plants can use the heat to generate steam to drive turbines and produce electricity.

Unlike incineration, which gives total combustion of waste leaving only noncombustible residue. gasification uses partial combustion to produce carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide and hydrogen. These three gases are known as 'syngas', which can be used to make a variety of chemicals. If burnt, syngas is highly efficient in generating steam to produce electricity

Gasification is not a new technique. Those of us old enough to remember the days before North Sea gas may have used the product of gasification of coal – town gas. This left a useful solid product – coke. Gasification of municipal waste will also leave some solid products that need to be disposed of, but these are small in comparison with the total amount of waste treated, and normally go to construction or to landfill once valuable items such as metals have been removed

There are plans to build a gasification plant on the Northacre Industrial Park in Westbury. This 'Advanced Thermal Treatment Facility' can get rid of municipal waste, create useful compounds for the chemical industry and generate electricity



from the heat. So, why have strong protests arisen?

The Westbury Gasification Action Group is concerned that the processes being implemented to remove particles from the flue gases may not be sufficient to prevent ultrafine particles being released, which may cause health issues downwind of the site. A 2017 review of the scientific literature on the health effects of incinerators stated that, although health problems had been identified in several studies, no causal link with incineration had been established. In other words, there is no proven linkage between incineration and adverse health effects on residents.

However, there is also huge concern from Westbury residents and our MP that transport of waste to the site would generate too much lorry traffic on the A350, as the economic model for the plant apparently required waste to come from many miles

away. Wiltshire Council has recently recommended that the plans are refused when they go to the Secretary of State for a final decision

In my view the ideal form of waste management is not to generate it in the first place. If that is not possible, then recycle! Incineration and landfill are less desirable than gasification, which does at least offer the chance to reuse some of the municipal waste as feedstock for chemical industries or as a high-value fuel. However, the protestors have a point - building a gasification plant very close to a town with limited access routes is not a good idea.





The Post is set in 1971 during Nixon's tenure as US President. It tells the story, from within the Washington Post, of the battle, started by the New York Times, to print the truth about the Vietnam war. At a pivotal time in American history, the White House administration threatens to prosecute the press to prevent publication of political papers on the grounds it would damage national security.

Although historical, there are clear parallels with today's antagonistic relationship between the US press

and administration. Through subtle promotion, it provides a timely reminder of the sanctity of a free press.

In their first film together, Steven Spielberg directs Meryl Streep in a subtle and shrewd performance as Post publisher Kay Graham, together with a dignified Tom Hanks as her executive editor

Thursday 18th October The Guernsey Literary & Potato Peel Pie Society (Certificate 12A)

Continuing our war-themed season as we move towards the centenary of Armistice Day, the Guernsey Literary & Potato Peel Society is set in the aftermath of WW2. The cumbersome name of what is a book club was coined to save a group of Guernsey islanders during Nazi occupation.

A letter sent by one book club member to a young London writer results in her visiting the island to unwrap their wartime experiences, along with secrets as yet unburied.

Simpler than its title suggests, the film is saved from being purely a love story through its 'whodunnit' twist and clever direction of a well-picked cast. The lead role belongs

to Lilv James of Downton Abbev and Darkest Hour, joined by Michiel Huisman, Penelope Wilton, Tom Courtenay and Matthew Goode

At the October film night, we will also be showing the 2018 Live Action Short Film Oscar winner 'The Silent Child' (20 minutes). This film has been requested by a few of our regular audience and we so are delighted that we have been able to get hold of it to show at Cinema Corsley.

Set in rural England, the story follows Libby, a profoundly deaf child. Her middleclass family; consisting of two elder siblings, a constantly



overwhelmed mother and a workaholic husband, seek out a quick fix to make their 'broken' child more equipped to handle the real world. But when they employ the help of a deaf-specialised social worker it becomes apparent that Libby is not the one who needs to be fixed



Seven Open Doors

Dear Friends,

My youngest child is now 31, but September will always be associated in my thoughts with new beginnings; with new, pristine school uniforms, with the nervous anticipation of getting to know a new teacher. But the thing that I associate with September more than anything else, and which still gives me a slight lurch of panic when I think about it, is the purchase of new shoes. Having to buy four children a new pair of shoes was a huge expense not to mention the actual awfulness of trying to find shoes that both fitted and did not offend the sensibilities of the aforementioned children, who had I may say, precise and exacting standards. Being a good mummy I did what was advised and bought my children good shoes, namely leather Startrite ones and had them properly fitted at a proper shoe shop. Of course this was all well and good when they were little and still thought I was the fount of all knowledge. Sadly, by the time they reached their mid teens these children with beautiful unmarked feet refused to kowtow to the dictates of their mother and chose their own footwear; need I say more. A couple of years ago I happened to notice my youngest daughter's feet which sadly, bore the marks of many an ill fitting shoe and I could have cried when I remembered the trouble I went to in caring for those feet.

We are all born with beautiful feet and there is something infinitely moving is there not about a newborn baby's, so tiny and perfect, so unmarked by the necessities of life and its demands. As brand spanking new human beings we arrive to inhabit lives that will mould us and mark us. Sometimes we will make good and healthy choices; sometimes choices that scar us, that twist us, to go back to the image of new shoes: that give us blisters or bunions. I like to think that when God looks at us her precious children - and yes she may weep at the terrible choices we make sometimes and the damage we inflict on ourselves and our fellow human beings - she sees us, really sees us with all the mess and mucked-upness of our lives, and in her eyes we are perfect and beautiful still. It is actually really hard for us to see ourselves the way God sees us, it is much easier to beat ourselves up as terrible failures than believe that we are precious, beautiful and loved.

All this makes me think of George Herbert's wonderful, wonderful poem, 'Love (111)' which starts 'Love bade me welcome' I haven't got room to write it out here but do go and read it, it is exquisite.

So enjoy September! And good luck with shoe buying and the start of a new term.



Apple Pressing

Juice or cider, cider or juice..?



This year we are bringing the apple pressing at the field forward by a month, to September.

It has been a very strange year for apples. The very cold spring meant that where we would normally have about a month of blossom as each variety comes into flower and is pollinated, they all came into bloom together. This meant the bees had to work very hard but they did a great job!

The number of apples this year seems to be high, but with the June drop (as apples that have defects are shed by the tree) stretching through to August, the crop may be no bigger. The very hot weather and lack of water also seems to have led to the apples being smaller than usual. Apples, along with lots of other fruit, seem to have ripened early with villagers asking about the pressing already.

The apple pressing day at the Playing Field will be on Saturday 15th September, 11am to 4pm We will follow up, for those that cannot make it, with a pressing at the Cross keys.

In the UK, a staggering 4.4 million whole apples are being thrown away untouched every day. That's just the ones bought from supermarkets and not those grown at home.

Making apples into juice or cider is a great way of using those unwanted apples from the garden and great fun for adults and kids. The juice can be frozen.

There is nothing better than drinking apple juice straight from the press, except maybe waiting three months and drinking cider from the bottle!

As always, we will be helping those who want to make cider with tips on the best way to do it along with being able to supply veast and equipment to those who have never done it before

Finally, It is amazing how much juice you get out of apples. When bringing along containers to put your juice in remember that however many containers you think you need, you will actually require at least twice as many – this will save you having to go home to rummage for empty milk bottles out of recycling, etc. As a guide, a bucket of apples will make up to 5 litres of juice.



Parish Council Briefing

Notes from the Parish Council meeting held on 26th July

The Chairman opened the meeting by giving a brief history of the proposed development at Barters Farm. The expected fresh planning application from Lochailort had been received and this was the single item for decision

The meeting was opened to the public to make their comments on the planning application. It was noted that Lochailort had made much effort to meet our previous objections and in particular the mix of housing included smaller houses and bungalows. Although the increase to 43 houses was not desirable if the land was to be approved for development it was noted that central government guidance would apply and 43 houses would be compliant with the guidance. At the end of the

discussion it was quite clear that the issue of traffic was the major concern.

The meeting went into closed session and the Council after much discussion concluded by accepting the development, subject to the land being zoned for such a development by the Secretary of State, but would object on the arounds of the increased traffic and the need for mitigation with particular reference to the A3098 junction with Cleyhill Gardens.

Crime exceptions data

These figures are based on an evaluation of data, over a two year rolling period. Using this data we can predict what figure is the average that should be reported in a specific month, and what are the higher and lower parameters that we may expect. Figures outside of these parameters are classed as Crime Exceptions.

Domestic Abuse figures will also be included in the values as it is on our Control Strategy but no details will be shared on these cases.

Warminster Town and Villages combined (Area Board)

Warminster Area board includes two beat areas, one for the Town, (ER11) and one for Rural and Villages (ER12). The data is as follows:

July 2018 showed a total of 120 crimes for the whole Warminster Area Board region against the average of 112.6 for this same month over the previous two years. This is within the parameters we would reasonably expect. There are no exceptions within the data

ER12 Warminster Rural and Villages Beat

July 2018 showed a total of 35 crimes for the ER12 area against the average of 36.8 for this same month over the previous two years. There are no exceptions within the data. The five largest crime groups

accounted for 91% of this recorded crime, as follows;

- Violence Against the person showed 12 crimes compared to the average of 9
- Burglary showed 8 crimes compared to the average of 5
- Theft showed 5 crimes compared to the average of 8.7
- Vehicle Crime showed 5 crimes compared to the average of 5.9
- Criminal damage showed 2 crimes compared to the average of 4.6

Crimes

Crime - Theft

Lane End, Corsley

Sometime in June (exact date not known) a male suspect stole power tools from the back of an unsecured van whilst it was parked on a drive. The tools have since been recovered in the Frome area.

Crime - Burglary (Business and Community) Corsley

On the 21st July suspect(s) jammed open the patio door of a chalet and were able to gain entry. Nothing was stolen or damaged from inside the property.

Crime - Burglary (Business and Community) Huntenhull Lane, Chapmanslade

Overnight on the 20th July, suspects entered insecure tack room and stole a horse rug. They also placed various items in buckets

which were then left in the yard. These were not stolen

Crime - Theft

High Street, Chapmanslade

Between 5.30pm on the 14th July and 10am on the 15th July, a suspect gained entry to a garage by smashing the padlock on the door and stole a petrol cutter to the value of £250.

Crime – Vehicle offences

Heaven's Gate, Horningsham

Between 5.45pm and 8pm on the 3rd July a suspect smashed the rear window of a vehicle. The suspect conducted a messy search inside the vehicle and removed items from within

Other information **Abandoned Vehicles**

Vehicles are not classed as abandoned if they are just badly parked, are causing an obstruction or are broken down.

You can check if the vehicle is taxed by going to www.vehicleenquiry.service.gov. uk to check (untaxed vehicles may not be abandoned and cannot be removed).

Are there any signs that the vehicle has not moved for some time i.e. weeds under the vehicle, mould or rubbish inside the vehicle, missing or flat tyres, broken windows?

Is it on a public highway or is it on private land? If a vehicle is on your land, check ownership before reporting. Abandoned vehicles can be reported to Wiltshire Council on their website, where they have a dedicated form that can filled in Alternatively you can call 0300 456 0100 on their general enquiry number to report this

Weekly Tasking meeting

Inspector Fee chairs a weekly internal tasking meeting where emerging community issues and concerns are raised and discussed for the whole West Wiltshire CPT area. From this meeting, priorities and actions are set and a tasking document produced. This involves developing strategies and the targeting of resources (including partner agencies) into tackling the issue or concern.

The Warminster Area currently has two specific matters:

Theft from cars in beauty spot and rural locations as previously reported is still continuing. However, it has been evident that offenders are also targeting more rural or remote locations possibly in-transit to beauty spots so please be vigilant.

- Be vigilant when parking up of suspicious vehicles or people in and around these areas who may be watching you.
- Try to park somewhere open and well-lit.
- Lock your vehicle including the boot
- Remember to close the windows and sunroof
- Don't leave anything on show in your car when you park – not even a coat or empty carrier bag.
- If you have a removable satnay, remove it and take it with you if possible. Remove the mounting, polish any marks off the windscreen and hide the cable and mounting.
- Store car ownership information at home, not in your car.
- Number plates are often stolen for criminal use. Use plates secured with antitheft screws, available from car accessory stores
- Try not to store things in the boot.

A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

The good, the bad and the ugly!

Since Judith wrote her last article, in which she quoted 'the driest and hottest weather since 1976', we had yet more hot and dry weather. The BBC quoted that the summer of 2018 was in fact the 'driest start to a summer since modern records began in 1961'. However, as I write this article, it has now rained and we have already had 40mm of rain in August. We are beginning to see the grass greening up, but we still really need 70-80mm of rain to put the lost moisture back into the soil, for the grass to grow properly.

The good...

Apart from us all enjoying lovely sunny holidays in the UK there have been some positives in the countryside too. Our lovely new-born calves are falling on mainly drier around than usual which is much more pleasant for all. The blackberries are out and I got to my secret spot before whoever beat me to it last year got there! Many of the arable crops and straw have been harvested 2-3 weeks early in ideal conditions which has negated the need for drying the crop. We should be able to harvest our maize at the end of September which will be far easier with slightly lighter nights, and drier fields, which again will make the whole operation more pleasant for all, including you readers as there will be less mud on the roads!

The bad...

None of the crops have yielded particularly well due to the weather, for example wheat

yields are probably half a tonne per acre less than normal. Crops such as straw are in high demand as livestock farmers are in search of feed and bedding to compensate for poor grass silage yields and having to use winter feed (as there has been no grass) to feed the animals through the summer. The fly population has been thriving and seem to have developed new skills to avoid my fly swat!!

The ugly...

The poor strawberry market has been hit hard as the fine weather bought both a glut in fruit production as well as all of the fruit ripening at once which has led to strawberries being given away free to feed anaerobic digester plants as opposed to gracing our dining tables with their beauty. Whilst all other crops have suffered from poor yields and there is high demand, of course prices rise which means the cost of producing food increases pretty much across the board. We are yet to establish whether this will have an impact on the price the consumer pays for food or whether the farmer or the producer will take the hit! The NFU met with Michael Gove (Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs) recently to discuss all of these issues and more: He is guoted to have said "We will make sure farmers have what they need in order to provide us with high-quality food and ensure their businesses survive". We have heard nothing since but, we will leave the issue in his capable hands!!
