

Barters Farm Nursery and Plant Centre

What lockdown has meant for us

How COVID-19 has affected one of our best-known village businesses

Following the government's announcement on 23rd March, we closed the nursery and the plant centre.

We were just about to put the concrete down for the base of the new water tank and foundations of the new potting shed so, sadly, the rebuilding all came to a grinding halt.

Our first priority was to look after our staff. Andrew, our Sales Manager, was shielding, so we set him up to work at home. Lesley, our nursery worker, and Barry, our driver, were both furloughed. Legh, Managing Director, and Nigel, Financial Director, both being of a certain age, started working from home. One member of staff left so 40% of our staff were unable to come to Barters. The staff who have been able to come to work have been very busy and brilliant at adapting to the change.

Our next priority was the plants, these had to be hand watered daily - as we had no tank, we had no irrigation. We were so thankful to see the rain in June!

We are extremely grateful to Wiltshire Council who awarded us a grant. This enabled us to set about installing a new computer so we could improve our sales via the website. We started with our trade customers as their jobs depend on getting a supply of plants for their work and many of them were able to continue working during the strict lockdown. They ordered, paid,

were invoiced and collected the plants at an appointed time. Then, in May we started selling to our plant centre customers, again via our website.

The good news is that, since the lockdown has been eased, the new water tank and new potting shed have been built and we are busy potting crops for next year.

Unfortunately, it's just not feasible to reopen the plant centre and to remain compliant at the moment, but you can order plants from the stock list (updated at least once a week) on our website and then collect your plants or have them delivered. There is a minimum order, so if you want just a few plants, why not join up with family, friends or neighbours to make an order.



Science: changing the world

Does thalidomide deserve a new reputation?

Many of us will remember the thousands of children born with severe birth defects because their mothers had been prescribed thalidomide in the 1950s to treat morning sickness during pregnancy.

The drug was used in Europe, but the number of cases of misshaped or missing limbs and other problems, possibly related to the drug, meant that it was refused a license by the Food and Drug Administration in the US. Although it was initially not clear that thalidomide caused such birth defects, as these were only seen if the drug was taken between the fourth and eight week of pregnancy, it was removed from the market in the early 1960s once the causal relationship was confirmed. Thalidomide

led to much more stringent testing regimes being put in place in many countries prior to any drug being approved for use.

Only in 2018 did it become clear how thalidomide causes these birth defects. Two conditions called Duane Radial Ray syndrome and Holt-Oram syndrome result in abnormalities similar to those caused by thalidomide and this led to an understanding of how thalidomide acted. It affects the expression of a large number of genes through inhibition of a regulatory protein, known as SALL4. However, although it does this in humans, primates and rabbits, it does not do this in the rodents on which the thalidomide was tested before use in humans. The genes affected include those for the development of limbs and may also result in defects in other organs.

In spite of the bad reputation that thalidomide had, the company Celgene

> launched it as a treatment for leprosy in 1998. Since then, thalidomide has been used under carefully supervised conditions to

treat skin lesions caused

by leprosy and some forms of cancer, particularly multiple myeloma. It is approved by the US Food and Drug Administration for these purposes. It has multiple actions and, like many drugs, has powerful curative properties but potentially severe side-effects. It is being investigated for use in treating other diseases and conditions, including inflammatory diseases affecting the skin, such as cutaneous lupus, HIV-related mouth and throat ulcers, and blood and bone marrow cancers.

Now that we know that thalidomide causes the birth defects through its action on SALL4, modified versions of the relatively simple thalidomide molecule (see figure) have been designed that have no effect on SALL4 but still have beneficial pharmaceutical effects. These new thalidomide-related drugs, such as lenalidomide and pomalidomide are approved for specific uses and other analogues are being developed.

Although the word 'thalidomide' conjures up specific thoughts about babies (and later adults) with deformed limbs, the hope is that in future the word will also be linked with successful treatments of cancers and other conditions.

Parish Council Briefing

Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the PC's activity in August

There were no remote PC meetings during August but four issues were dealt with through our COVID-19 lockdown procedures, i.e. public notices on village notice-boards and The Bridge website, plus consultation within the PC by email. These issues included two planning matters, the White Hart licence application consultation and a follow-on action from the road safety work at the Heath. These are detailed below.

At the time of writing, there were no pressing or outstanding matters which suggest that a public remote meeting is needed to cover the usual September quarterly meeting which, in itself, is not required to fulfil the legally required minimum quota of four per year. The requirement will be reviewed early in September and public notification given if this position changes.

Planning issues 19/10108/WCM **Corsley House Bund**

An appeal against the refusal of this planning application was notified by Wiltshire on 20th July. The appeal will be decided on the basis of written submissions.

At our meeting on 2nd December 2019 the PC considered the original application, having received a presentation from the project consultants and had an open public discussion and Q&A session. The response was agreed and can be viewed on the planning website. A full report of the planning application and the PC's conclusion was published in the January 2020 edition of The Bridge and this elicited

one response from the village.

The appeal notice letter has been posted on the two village noticeboards and The Bridge website with an accompanying note, the gist of which was that the PC would offer the same comments to the appeal, unless any new considerations that any affected resident may wish to be taken into account were received. At the time of writing no such representations have been received. By the time of publication of this edition of The Bridge magazine, the deadline of 24th August will have passed and any further developments will be notified next month.

20/05386/FUL

Cross Keys pub Lyes Green - conversion of existing first floor function space

To provide four bed & breakfast rooms with en-suite bathrooms associated with the public house. New windows, rooflights and external fire escape staircase. This proposal seeks to convert the existing function room, the 'Oak Apple Room' into four B&B bedroooms, two en-suite and two with a shared bathroom, taking up all the existing space on the first floor of this wing of the pub. The only external observable changes would be three additional windows on the west and south elevations, a skylight in the roof facing west above the bedrooms and a new fire escape from the first floor at the rear, landing in the pub garden behind the existing rear outbuilding. The capacity of the sewage system will be. No change is proposed to the parking capacity, which at the worst

would have to cater for three extra cars.

The PC unanimously agreed no objection to this proposal.

White Hart pub - licence variation application

The Wiltshire Council Licencing Panel hearing for this application took place on 4th August, as indicated last month, as an online meeting attended by Adelle Gill, the licence holder, myself and Simon Jasper for the PC and three Lane End residents, representing five households at Lane End. The panel consisted of three Wiltshire Councillors. supported by staff. It was a good meeting, well chaired, and the panel took in the major point in all the submissions, the issue of potential excessive late night noise and rowdiness which could arise from the application for extensions to the time allowed for music.

The final determination was that the variation would be granted, but that the extension to the timings for music would be limited to 11.30, not midnight as requested, and then only on Fridays, Saturdays and bank holidays, 12 times per year. A noise management plan, tabled by Ms Gill (produced in conjunction with Longleat and Wiltshire officials) was added as a condition to be met. This plan relates to indoor amplified and recorded music, behind closed doors and windows. (Outdoor non-amplified music is allowed under non-licence rules, up to 11pm.) A condition was also imposed that 14 days' public notice must be given of any amplified

music event at the pub.

Two additional points should be noted. First, the law does not allow any more representations to be made to the Licensing Panel on the same issues raised at the hearing, for a period of 12 months. Second, the Panel did not and cannot consider any road safety issues, for apparent legislative reasons. (Road safety is entirely the bailiwick of the Highways Authority, who are not on the list of 'responsible authorities' consulted in any licence application). I made the point that this was an unsatisfactory aspect of the process, since road safety at the Lane End junction is, and has been, an ongoing significant village concern. A licence decision for the White Hart, which has potential impact on the road safety at Lane End through late night customers driving away from the pub, should have included a road safety consideration. However, notwithstanding these two points, it was made clear by the panel Chair we are perfectly entitled to bring concerns about such issues as excessive noise or safety to the relevant Wiltshire departments if and when we believe there is any issue.

All contributors to the meeting, including myself, made the point that they had no wish that the pub would do other than thrive and provide a successful addition to the range of outlets in the village. Ms Gill was at great pains to reiterate her desire to get on with the village. She has offered free entry to the village to any of the pub music events, plus help with PC attempts to mitigate road safety concerns at Lane End.

Roads Speed Review

Since publication of the last edition of The Bridge there has been a meeting of the Community Area Transport Group (CATG) at which the request for a speed review of the 40mph limit at Corsley Heath was granted Priority One status. Wiltshire Highways is keen to get on with the review and the CATG voted and confirmed allocation of funding, with the normal PC 25% contribution. The PC has agreed to fund this contribution at \pounds 700. It is stressed that the outcome of a review is not preordained and could result in no change.


Re-surfacing

The order diverting this PROW has now been made and has been published in the usual places. Representations are invited, with a deadline of 4th September – details can be found on the notice. The PC was consulted and supported the original application as a sensible safety measure to avoid the existing very dangerous exit point on the A362, at the corner of a field about 100m west of the point where Sydnalls Lane joins the A362.


Grants are also funded by donations and legacies, and supplemented by income from events, such as the annual Secret Gardens of the Close afternoon.

Salisbury Cathedral: a message from...

The Bishop of Salisbury

The 800th anniversary of the founding of the new cathedral in Salisbury was distinctly different from that which had been so carefully planned.

In a way it demonstrated that one of the reasons the Christian Church has endured and is a great missionary religion is its adaptability. A faith based on death and resurrection is constantly being reinvented in witness to the eternal life of Christ.

In this case, the building was closed because of the Government's lockdown in response to coronavirus - services moved online and have been surprisingly well attended.

The building, of course, endured and remained a potent symbol of hope in the city and diocese, pointing beyond itself to God and earthing heaven as it has done in all times.

The whole experience of lockdown because of a virus has made us all think about what matters and why. We live globally and locally.

Churches and places of worship were not seen by our Government as essential, but were dealt with like a social club and as leisure and tourism. It felt a bit like Simon Jenkins describing parish churches as "the museums of England".

In some ways it's accurate and quite helpful, but misses the most important point. A cathedral or church is first and foremost a place of worship. In worship we place ourselves in relationship to God, one another and all creation. Worship is part of what it is to be fully human.

Religion is an expression of the individual in relation to God but it is a corporate activity, the worship of God by a community of faith.

There has been an upside. The closure of our church buildings meant we were able to emphasise the importance of 'faith at home'.

Across the diocese, church communities have been central to community initiatives, caring for the most vulnerable in these unprecedented times. Online worship has been a revelation, with people looking at each other's faces rather than at the back of the head of the person sitting in front. Numbers attending online have been greater than those previously attending church.

Maybe we have all been feeling so isolated that to find a way of belonging or being with others for a shared time each day or week has had greater priority? Online worship has engaged some people who don't normally come to church and some silver surfers who were unable physically to attend church have loved being able to engage again from home.

We live in an age and in a part of the world that greatly values the individual and freedom of choice. Lockdown has shown us some of the limits to this. We need institutions, organisations, buildings that support and strengthen our common life.

The cathedral - and any church building does this not just as a meeting house. God can be worshipped everywhere and anywhere, but our churches are places where we can do the deep business with God not just as individuals or households, but together.

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

John foster summarises the August meeting...

The meeting on the 13th August was held using Microsoft Teams as the use of such media allows the activities of the Parish Council to continue during the current COVID-19 situation. The public are able to join the meeting and take part and observe in the usual manner. John Lewis was acting chair in the absence of Keith Muston.

The meeting included one member of the public who raised questions concerning the Thoulstone Park planning application: the start and projected completion dates for the development - stated as December 2020 for completion by the end of 2022; whether the development lead had changed - it had not.

The meeting then addressed two subject areas – finance and planning:

Finance

It was unanimously agreed to raise the donation for the cost of the poppy wreath for the British Legion Poppy Appeal by £,5 to f,125.00 for this year.

Planning

Application 20/05394/FUL Thoulstone Park Golf Club Construction of small farm shop and cafe with associated access track and surface water basin.

The application was discussed and no objections were raised.

Application 20/05280/VAR Thoulstone Farm

Variation of condition 9 (approved plans) of planning application 19/11065/ FUL (Construction of outdoor pool and associated pool building (revised design).

Councillors felt that while this variation was a better use of space, concerns remained that the gap created in the damaged listed wall was still shown in the plans and should be fully reinstated in accordance with the recent decisions shared by the enforcement officer. The council had no objections to the application subject to the wall reinstatement conditions.

Application 20/06460/PNCOU Thoulstone Farm.

Notification of Prior Approval for a Change of Use of Agricultural Building to 4 no. Dwelling houses (Class C3), and for building operations reasonably necessary for the conversion.

The issue of the gap in the wall (see above) remained. In addition, concerns were raised due to the lack of clarity around the endstate of the completed development. It was proposed that the council should seek an opportunity to talk with the developer to understand the overall plan for the site, enabling the application to be understood in the context of the overall site. With the deadline for the consultation being 31st August, the councillors agreed to defer the final decision on this until the developer feedback had been received.

The next planned meeting will be held on 10th September 2020.



Large Reclining Figure by Henry Moore keeps watch in the rain on the cathedral's 800th birthday in April




Sadly, Confluence, the muchanticipated flower festival has been postponed due to the coronavirus restrictions.

God keeps his promises

We're living in uncertain times – because of COVID-19 many lives have been tragically cut short, and 'normal' routines like going to work, even having a job to go to, and holidays are all uncertain. We hope things will improve, but many countries are still affected by this pandemic and we have reports of fresh spikes here.

Yet, in all this uncertainty, one thing is certain - God is faithful to his promises. The time of harvest reminds us of the promise given to Noah, that 'While the earth remains. seedtime and harvest. cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease (Genesis 8, verse 22). The hymn writer Thomas Chisholm, summed this up in the hymn, 'Great is thy Faithfulness':

A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

Autumn and the harvest are well under way as Judith writes about activities on the farm

Once again the weather in August has dominated most of the farm's activities except the natural gestation time of the livestock – come rain or shine the birth of livestock carries on and, at the moment, the young dairy heifers are giving birth to their first calves (heifer is the name given to female calves up until age of around two years old, when they have their first calf).

Much breeding research has been done over the centuries to find the perfect dairy and beef animals and, with the use of artificial insemination being more readily available since the 1950's, breeds from all over the world have been introduced into the traditional British farm animals. Our herd of milking cows are mainly black and white Friesian crossed with Canadian or New Zealand breeds, whereas cows producing beef calves will be cross-bred with Aberdeen Angus or a continental bull. The heifers are introduced into the herd a month or so before calving to get used to the routine of getting extra feed in the parlour and getting into a routine of going through the milking parlour twice a day with all the sounds of voices and machinery.

Everyone involved with the dairy cows has to be willing to work long hours during the calving period as cows are like humans and will have their calves at anytime day or night and, like humans, there is often the need for a helping hand to bring a healthy calf into the world.

Autumn calves are usually born out in the fields which is considered to be easier and more natural for the cow and there's less chance of the new born calf picking up infection. Cows become super-protective of their calves so great care must be taken if you find yourself walking in a field with cows and their calves.

Harvesting the cereal crops has been a couple of weeks ahead of our norm and it certainly looks like the maize crop will be harvested in September. The maize has really thrived in the heat of this summer's sun and some crops are particularly tall this year.

We will soon be losing our summer breeding birds – I have heard of three hatchings of swallows this year. I do hope they will be strong enough to fly the long distances they need to travel to their homes in the southern hemisphere.

Our hedges and woodland are bursting with colour and fruits of all kinds and lots of nuts and berries, do enjoy the blackberries growing freely in the hedgerows and, if you are out early in the morning, there is just a chance of finding some lovely field mushrooms.

Sadly, due to coronavirus, it is unlikely that we will be able celebrate our wonderful harvest with suppers and Church services. We do hope to have an open-air service in Corsley Old School Playing Fields (near St Margaret's Church) on September 27th at 10.30 (weather permitting) when everyone is welcome.


