

St Margaret's

Update from meeting held on 20th July

Thank you everyone who came to show your support for St Margaret's Church on the evening of 20th July. Nearly 40 people attended and it meant a lot to see that St Margaret's church was clearly considered to be an integral part of Corsley village.

85 individual ideas were suggested which covered several areas: church maintenance, ideas for fund-raising and income generation, as well as making the church a more flexible space.

An immediate concern is to address the maintenance issues which are impacting on the fabric of the building – such as the leaky roof. In the short term, fixing these problems will really help to make the church a more attractive venue for all sorts of purposes.

A key message from Ian Buick, Parish Treasurer, surprised many; churches do not receive any funds from the Diocese. All funds for maintenance and upkeep (including the electricity and heating bills) are raised through fund raising efforts, regular individual giving as well as what you might give in the collection plate after a service. We are never on our own

These words were written to me by a lady at Clink Evangelical Church, in Frome. Since losing my car, I've become a regular at their Coffee Mornings, not just our own at Whitbourne Chapel each month. Maureen's been concerned, since the pandemic began in 2020, about how isolated and lonely people have become, especially the elderly. She

quoted Jesus' words to the disciples in John 15, verse 12: Love each other as I have loved you.

These words touched a chord in me, because it's a scary step, from driving one's self about to relying on public transport. I felt isolated

until Jesus' words hit home, so I decided to speak to people in the queues, on the buses, in the streets. It wasn't easy at first, because Maureen's right; people have become isolated, and frightened, too. It's as if everyone fears what you want from them - they don't feel anyone can be greeting them without a motive.

The people on the Thursday bus to Devizes are a mostly friendly bunch, who speak to each other as they climb aboard. Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Councillor Phil Holihead rounds up the PCs latest activities

At a crowded meeting held on 27 July in Chapmanslade's Village Hall the following were the key issues:

Planning

PL/2023/05142/FUL: Erection of a rural workers dwelling house, Sienna's Valley Farm.

The Parish Council (PC) objected to this application on the basis of it being outside the development boundary and within the special landscape area, and that its design was incongruous with its proposed surroundings. A similar application had previously been rejected by Wiltshire Council and the PC could see no tangible changes other than a new position for the house that could justify a different outcome for this application. The PC asked our Unitary Councillor, Bill Parks, to consider calling this in for the planning committee as there is a long history of applications at the site which impact on the development boundary and the special landscape area.

PL/2023/05349/FUL: Erection of 9 dwellings, demolition, and associated works at former commercial nursery, Barters Plant Centre.

The PC objected to this application on the grounds of it being outside the development boundary; that there were no requirements to build these houses as Chapmanslade's quota for new development between 2020 and 2038 was now zero; and to prevent ongoing and considerable disruption for the residents

of Cley Hill Gardens. The PC asked our Unitary Councillor, Bill Parks, to consider calling this in for the planning committee as it has the potential for considerable and perhaps ongoing impacts on the development boundary.

PL/2023/05779/FUL: House holder planning permission for changes to dormer windows, 115A Forest Walk, Chapmanslade.

The PC had no objections to this application.

The meeting was appraised of the objection that the PC had raised earlier in the month with Somerset County Council regarding a proposed farm shop on Lodge Hill. The main reason for Chapmanslade PC's objection had been centred around traffic volume in the village, and road safety concerns on the bend on Lodge Hill where the deliveries entrance and exit were proposed. Councillor Bill Parks had supported the PC in its approach to Somerset Council which, despite the farm having a Chapmanslade address, had failed to consult us on the application.

Licensing

Application for new premises licence at Thoulstone Park.

This item drew the largest amount of attention and many residents of Short Street and Thoulstone spoke at the meeting adding to the deluge of email objections from the neighbouring communities. The application was for a carte blanche licence

to cover a variety of unspecified events including possible music festivals over a year with options for late night closures at 2am on weekends and early starts every day from 6am. The PC objected to the application to the Licensing Authority based on the risk of considerable public nuisance and especially noise, the risk to persons and property, and the risk of disorder based upon historical evidence from previous events at the site. The PC recommended that more focussed and accurate applications for specific events would allow the community the chance to make informed decisions about acceptability. The application went to the licensing subcommittee on 15 August 2023.

Other

It was agreed that Ian Curtis, a resident of Short Street would join the PC as a co-opted member. Welcome!

Streetscene

An update was given on the resurfacing of the High Street from the Somerset border to the junction with Huntenhull Lane. Work took place from 21 August until 2 September and further information shots were on the PC website and village Facebook page. There was the predicted disruption, but the resurfacing teams were experienced at working inside communities and mad every effort to ensure access to properties etc. As part of the work the signs outside the school were changed to make the 'KEEP CLEAR' area enforceable, and there were new 'SLOW' signs on both

approaches to the junction with the entrance to the Village Hall.

A topographical survey of the High Street has now taken place. This is the first step prior to ongoing work investigating the possibility of traffic calming measures as well as a 20mph speed limit in the centre of the village.

Options for projects to be funded by S106 and CIL funds were further outlined and are taking shape. The PC looks forward to being presented with a final list of projects to agree priorities and funding.

Some slight progress was made regarding HGV weight limits and the three villages group were able to make detailed presentations of our individual village situations to the new Cabinet Member for Transport and our MP at a meeting in June; both were very receptive. Thanks should go to Councillor Bill Parks and Dr Andrew Murrison MP for their unswerving support for the villages in this matter and for representing our concerns so clearly to Wiltshire Council.

Next meeting

The next PC meeting is scheduled for 14 September at 7.30 in the Village Hall.



Wonderful Walks



Our walk today is at Mere. Park your car in Salisbury Street car park (toilets are here, too) and walk to the back of the car park, where you'll see steps down to Dark Lane. Go that way and turn right – and you're on the Monarch's Way. This is roughly the escape route used by King Charles II after the Battle of Worcester in 1651, during the Civil War won by Oliver Cromwell and his 'Roundhead' Army. I always thought Charles II was in France throughout the war, but apparently not! You'll exit Dark Lane near Jean Electrical store, in part of the United Reformed Church building.

Turn left onto Petteridge Lane and there's an army-type 'hut' further along the lane, on the right. Walk that way and you'll see the

building has a blue façade with a Madonna statue: this is Mere's Roman Catholic church. You're on the left-hand side of the road for the pavement, but that peters out and you'll need to change sides. Later, near thatched Lordsmead Cottage, this pavement

> disappears, so cross the lane again carefully here, as there's a sharp bend right, ahead. As you use the bridge, look over the left side; what are the long twin lines in the water for? My theory is 'tram lines', bringing goods down the nearby hill on small 'sledges'

or carts in the 18th and 19th centuries. to where it could be taken by local boatmen to a bigger river, probably the Stour. This is Shreen Water, part of a community flood prevention scheme from the late 1700s, when




the water meadows here were formed.

Stay with the main street, which rounds the right-hand bend ahead, into Clements Lane. You'll pass a glass conservatory, almost hanging over the left-hand pavement you're on. This is part of the Walnut Tree inn and I called in for facilities, latte and biscuits (of course!). Afterwards, I explored, as the nearby housing scheme has several footpaths going in different directions. Staying with Clements Lane was my second diversion, taking me to the Town Mill House. I had to return to the Inn after, but not before finding another section of the Monarch's Way, with a wooden signpost pointing to 'Charnage', via a huge field.

Back at the Walnut Tree, there's a tiny footpath opposite the Inn, to the right of a building site; go that way. Eventually, it leads to Lordsmead Mill. There was probably a mill here from the Middle Ages, but this mill was 'rebuilt' in the 1830s, with an iron waterwheel and machinery, providing power for the local flax and silk mills. Later, a pumphouse was added, to pump water locally. The large waterwheel was removed in the Second World War, but the pumphouse is now being restored; it's hoped that this

water could be used for generating electricity. Cross the wooden bridge here and you'll find Mead House and, beside it, another narrow



Keep going and you'll reach a wide lane, with a signpost by the far hedge. I went right, though, alongside the cemetery wall, and called in for a look round, as a green sign on the gatepost mentions Commonwealth War Graves.

Graveyards and cemeteries can teach us a lot about the past; the big, tomb-like grave with its lovely inset tiles wasn't for a farm labourer or mill worker... Nor was the plain iron cross, with multiple children's names on, for a wealthy family, though they lost children, too. There are four Commonwealth War Graves in a row, left of the path to the chapels here, but look for another one on its own, not for a young soldier, but for a Canadian man aged 53, serving with the Canadian Army Vet Corps.

Leave the cemetery and a



car park is opposite, with another Monarch's Way tag nearby, pointing to a footpath; go that way. There were sheep in a field on the right when I did this walk, plus iron gates to a private house on the left. Stay with the later stone wall, curving left into the churchyard and then walk ahead, out





onto Church Street. On the far side of the road is Mere Library and Museum, but I needed more facilities and sustenance and headed right, for my usual haunt, the Angel Corner café. After that, I waited by Mere's lovely floral display in the Market Square, for the bus back across the Deverills to Warminster!

Whitbourne Chapel

'Even the wind and waves obey him ... ' Luke 8, verse 25

Will your anchor hold?

You may have heard of Church Island on Anglesey, North Wales. It has a small Church, St Tysillo's, and only way to access the island is to walk across a causeway. There is a replacement now but, previously, the old causeway could flood should a strong westerly wind bring the tide in sooner than expected. So, there was a time when, during church services, a boy was left on the causeway and should the tide come in too quickly he'd shout "tide coming!" Priest and congregation would quickly gather their things and run back

across the causeway to safety.

In Luke's Gospel (Chapter 8 verses 22 – 25), he records an incident where the Lord Jesus was with his disciples in a boat on the sea of Galilee, when suddenly a strong wind rose up. The Lord was asleep and the Disciples were afraid the wind and waves would overtake them. They woke Jesus, telling him they were in great danger. Luke tells us that Jesus arose and with a word calmed the storm. The astonished disciples asked "Who is this, even the wind and waves obey him?".

In response, the Lord Jesus asked them, "Where is your faith?" They needed to put their complete trust in Him for all times and situations. We need to do the same, asking first that he will forgive us, and then grant us faith in him. To do otherwise means we are in great danger of being swept away by the things of this life, rather than truly looking forward to the life that is to come.

The hymn writer, Priscilla Jane Owens asks "Will your anchor hold in the storms of life?" and the chorus is "We have

> an anchor that keeps the soul steadfast and sure while the billows roll: fastened to the rock which cannot move,

grounded firm and deep in the Saviour's love!" Will your anchor hold?

Countryside Matters

What happened to summer?

Just in case you are wondering what happened to summer, we had it back in June!!

Our July 2023 record of rainfall will be of little surprise:

July 2023 – 150.9 mm; **July 2022** – 4.6 mm **2022** total to July – 323 mm **2023** total to July – 598.9 mm.

Yes, nearly twice as much this year as last year, no wonder the British talk about the weather so much; it affects our lives, especially those living and working in the Countryside

Unfortunately, so many holidays and days out for village and county events have been spoilt because of the weather, but hopes will be alive for the Corsley Fayre, Frome Show on Saturday September 9th and Corsley House Gardens Open for The National Garden Scheme, Sunday 10th September.

The golden fields of wheat and barley have been harvested with mixed results of yields but, due to the seed needing drying now it's in storage and the loss of food value due to weather conditions through the growing season, there will not be the food value when feeding it to animals or for beer and human consumption.

Nevertheless, next year's crops are to be planted this month when the seeds will be direct drilled with as little ploughing of the fields as possible to reduce soil compaction and have less runoff of soil and nutrients into the water courses.

Already we're seeing the change in leaf colour in our gardens, woodlands and forests. How grateful we must be to our ancestors planting such beautiful trees for us and the

wildlife to enjoy and, hopefully, we will take up our late Queen's wishes to plant trees for future generations.

Autumn has brought some wonderful crops of fruit, with trees hanging with plums, pears and apples of all sorts, some for immediate eating and others for storing in both modern and traditional ways.

Don't forget those lovely hedgerows fruits such as blackberries, elderberries and rosehips that are free to all - don't forget to leave some for the wildlife though!

Those with eagle-eyes may even find field mushrooms nestled in the grass or in stubble fields (where the arable crop has been harvested); cut the stems with a sharp knife and rinse them in a little water and cook them when they are still pink. They're delicious when freshly picked before breakfast and fried in a little butter and served on toast.

We will say goodbye to our summer bird visitors as they gather in groups for safety on their journey to warmer climes, but enjoy our resident birds, robins blackbirds, thrushes, sparrows feeding on the fallen seeds in the fields and hedgerows. Watch the buzzards, kites and carrion birds catching small mammals scurrying through the harvested fields. Keep your eye out for the murmurations of starlings as they gather in the sky as dusk draws in.

Autumn is a month of celebration in the countryside - join in the Church festivals and suppers and make the most of living in the countryside
